
The Minibeasts dressed up as their favourite book character to celebrate World Book Day, we read lots of books and recited our favourite lines from different books and even had time to act out different stories.





We have started reading a new class book about Loki the God of Mischief! The children wrote brilliant character descriptions about Loki and enjoyed designing their own mythical characters before turning them into Top Trumps cards to play with. In Maths, we have been learning about fractions. They have been trying very hard and have answered lots of tricky fraction questions. We have been making the most of the warmer weather too by taking our reading books out to the garden to enjoy some independent reading time in the sunshine. Overall, it has been a lovely half term and I look forward to more adventures with Prep 4 in the Summer term!





Prep 5 have had another excellent and busy half term. This half term, we learnt all about Climate Change. We looked at Climate Change from both a world-wide and local perspective. We developed our understanding of the climate cycle and how human actions are negatively affecting it. We owe a huge thanks to you, the parents, this half term.

We enjoyed a fantastic visit and talk from Mr Minns. a climate change scientist communicator who led a discussion about what we can do around the school to reduce our We also carbon footprint. enjoyed presentation sent in by Mr Oliver, who works within the oil and gas industry, about the UK's energy consumption and what oil and gas companies are doing to reduce their carbon footprint. In English, we wrote formal letters to Clive Lewis MP, encouraging him to visit our school and discuss Norwich's targets for climate change. In Maths, we extracted and analysed data from a range tables and line graphs.

In Prep 6, much of our learning has been around the pressing topic of Sustainability. In Geography, we rolled our sleeves up for some field study in our own school environment, learning all about the problems of plastic pollution and undertaking a bin audit in areas around school to investigate our own use of it. Prep 6 were not impressed with what they found in the staffroom bins! With their findings, they wrote a report and represented their data in bar charts.

Armed with this and all their research of plastic pollution in our oceans, they concluded their learning on formal letters by writing to a supermarket of their choice to find out what they are doing to reduce plastic packaging. We are very much hoping to receive some replies...

Continuing the theme of sustainability, we thoroughly enjoyed our PTA-funded STEM kits, making a series of solar-powered items including a desk fan, fairground ride and boat. The latter caused much excitement as we held boat races in the garden! Meanwhile, Prep 6 loved practical circuit-making in Science – we even made traffic lights!

Our RE began with preparing Lenten promises before exploring the events of Holy Week. One of the highlights was using historical evidence to plan arguments for or against the question, "Did Jesus have a fair trial?", which prompted a passionate class debate. Our annual trip to St John's Cathedral to experience some of the Stations of the Cross was an opportunity for prayer and reflection on Our Lord's sacrifice.

With such a busy term, it was refreshing to have some wonderful singing practice preparing for our Easter concert and acting out a Passion play for our Easter assemblies.
