We had the most amazing time at Africa Alive for our class Trip – seeing new animals, and in particular a new found love of lemurs by all the class.

Prep 1 had a fierce Sports Day – with all children taking part, and showing support and encouragement for their friends. I have never seen a class so pleased to see their friends win, over themselves! It has been amazing to be a part of the children's progression and development this year, both academically but also socially.

In our topic work we have studied Kenya; learning about the geography of the country and everyone's favourite part of the topic – the Kenyan wildlife! The children painted some amazing African Sunset pictures with their silhouetted animals. Prep 2, I have just loved teaching your art lessons this year- you are such a talented, creative bunch!

This term Prep 3 have been very busy! Shortly after half term, we had a fantastic day out at Banham Zoo with Mrs Thornton, Miss Pink, Mrs Laudan and Mrs Potter. In particular, the children loved seeing the penguins, sea lions and giraffes. We thoroughly enjoyed watching "Hooch" the Eagle Owl and the vultures flying in the bird show as well as spotting cheetahs, snow leopards and siamangs.

Back in the classroom we have been working very hard. In English, we have been learning about persuasive language and advertisements. Children have enjoyed working in groups to write and present their own amazing adverts for Trainers. We had some incredible designs and descriptions, including "Rainbow Hearts" to help you run faster, trainers which use magnets to make you quicker and some which even allow you to run up walls and along ceilings! We are now enjoying some Animal Poems to end this year and have been learning about the different features of poetry.

In Maths we have been learning how to make scale drawings of shapes based on their measurements. We have been using our times table facts to work out a remainder and calculating how many biscuits can be divided between plates.

Our Geography topic this term was 'The UK'. Prep 3 have been learning and finding the names of different counties, cities, mountains and rivers. Our Art topic follows on from this and we have been exploring scenes of the city and countryside, including pointillism river scenes, dramatic sunsets and cityscape models. In French, Prep 3 have impressed me with their knowledge of numbers and have been learning how to say the days of the week and different dates in French. Prep 3 are excelling with their knowledge of Scratch in our Computing lessons and can make moving animations using different backgrounds. In Science, we have been learning about Rocks. We have identified different kinds of rocks and have been thinking about what the fossils of modern-day animals might look like in the future.

We have explored the topic in great depth and the children have worked hard to produce their own project; choosing their point of interest to build this from. As a class, we have been partaking in healthy debates and all of the children have been fantastic at listening to others and arguing their case on a structured and knowledgeable basis.

We had lots of fun on our trip to Gressenhall where the children fully immersed themselves in a day as an evacuee child in WW2. We all dressed up and took part in lots of activities including: Home Guard training with moral boosting activities; working on the land and looking after the animals; rationing and making food out of those ingredients; and so much more!

Over the last term, Prep 4 have been very busy rehearsing for their theatre production of Pandora's Box. There has been an amazing level of commitment from all of the children and we are all very proud of their achievements! Their acting skills and

musicality have been pushed and they have all gone above and beyond to achieve their goals.





Prep 5 have had a fun – filled few weeks this half term. An obvious highlight has been performing in the Prep 5 and 6 productions of 'The Nightingale'. The Prep 5 children made the most of their smaller roles and I am sure that you would agree that the acting and singing was fantastic. The main topic this term has been our study of the Vikings; Prep 5 has been engaged in all sorts of activities to bring this fascinating chapter of history to life, including devising adverts for Viking warriors, creating Viking knot patterns and using clay to create runic messages on swords, statues and more. In Computing, the children have enjoyed creating newspaper articles depicting Viking raids and have created informative information sheets based on their own research.

Prep 5 have also been creative in the kitchen; the children created and ate delicious dips and snacks on our Mexican day, and also enjoyed making and eating German – style pretzels. Fun was had by all at our trip to Eaton Vale Activity Centre, where they engaged in archery, cooking, buggy racing, axe throwing and raft building! Prep 5 have also shown good knowledge and inventiveness when they created board games based on some of the topics we have covered over the course of the year. It has been a very exciting and energetic half term; the children of Prep 5 are more than ready for a well-earned break!





It has been a whirlwind half term for Prep 6. The first week was spent on our annual residential at a hostel in Llangollen, Denbighshire. We were truly blessed with dry, sunny weather which enabled us to enjoy a wonderful week of white-water rafting, a hike to the top of a local hill to Castell Dinas Bran, trips to Rhyl beach and Chester Zoo (below), and an exhilarating ride on a roller coaster through a forest!

On our return, we relived our adventures as we wrote detailed recounts in English of our amazing trip, while in Maths we have been applying our learning this year

to plan a trip abroad, not only using calculation skills for budgets, but also currency conversion for spending money, data handling for comparing temperatures and rainfall and timetables for planes and trains. Who knew holidays involved so much Maths! In Science, the children have learned all about the circulatory system and how to lead a healthy life-style, creating their own board games using their new learning.

In Humanities, we launched the topic of Global Trade and the Economy with an exciting (and very noisy) trading game where the children experienced first-hand what is like to be a poor or rich country. One group (a developing country) suffered flooding (a cup of water) which ruined their crops (paper) and therefore produce (paper 2D shapes) and were not best pleased! We have had an introduction to Hinduism in RE, learning about the spread of Hinduism across the globe, the main beliefs and gods.

It was the turn of cookery in DT, so Prep 6 have become budding chefs. First they followed instructions to make three different types of burger and sauces, then, applying their healthy eating learning, they designed a healthy burger they would like to eat, complete with fillings. On the penultimate day of term, we made our burgers and celebrated the end of our learning with a picnic in the garden.



Parallel to all of this have been intense

rehearsals leading up to our final performances of Nightingale to the Prep 5 and 6 parents. The play was especially enjoyed after missing the opportunity last year. It was wonderful for the children to be able to sing their hearts out and express themselves on stage so passionately - a true celebration.

As our current cohort of Prep 6 have prepared their NDPS memory books this week, we have shared many anecdotes of fun lessons, trips, plays, matches, concerts and comical moments over the years. 
