

Hope for Haiti HOSPITAL

With over 8,000 patients seen annually, our three-story, 17,000 square foot facility is a place of healing. Children and families travel to Ouanaminthe from across the country for care, as our medical staff is able to diagnose patients with on-site radiology and lab equipment and treat patients with an on-site pharmacy.

Our Hospital provides the following:

- NICU Program
- Inpatient Care
- Air Ambulance
- Emergency Room
- Operating Room
- Dental Clinic
- Outpatient Malnutrition Services



Our NICU unit opened in 2023 and is the only neonatal facility within 2 hours of our community!

Our hospital provides families and children access to quality healthcare. Doctors, nurses, dentists, and other trained medical professionals perform primary medical and dental care. The hospital is a place of hope for parents and children; each patient not only receives physical care, but is also offered the opportunity to experience the love of Christ.



As poverty and instability continue to have great impacts on the entire country, our greatest need and prayer is to be able to expand our emergency department at the hospital so we can treat more patients and add to our staff.



The Hope for Haiti School provides quality primary and secondary education. This includes daily Bible curriculum which is equipping the next generation of leaders in Haiti. We currently have 363 students and consider it an honor to educate and prepare each of these children for their future.

We believe these children, though their journey hasn't been easy, are the future leaders of Haiti. Our prayer continues to be that they use their knowledge and unique talents to bring hope and change to their country.



Last year 16 students graduated from high school and this year we anticipate 19 graduates. This is a huge milestone for students in the nation of Haiti. Whether students excel after graduation or need additional support, our desire is to continue to invest in them relationally and spiritually.

PROVIDING NUTRITION - DAILY

Amidst a severe hunger crisis in Haiti



It's recently been stated by the UN World Food Programme that 4.9 million Haitians are currently facing food insecurity. We truly believe every meal matters and makes a difference in preventing malnutrition. While the focus of the feeding program at Danita's Children is providing nutritious meals to children in school, we also provide meals to patients and families at our hospital. Our feeding program provides 16,000 meals/month on average to some of Haiti's most vulnerable children who live both on and off campus.

The gift of a meal is more than just filling an empty stomach. School meals meet basic nutritional needs while keeping children focused in the classroom.



For many of the students in our school, the only meal they eat each day is the one they receive at school.

This year we experienced obstacles due to the instability of Haiti and the impact it has on the food and supply chain. Thankfully, your donations made it possible to purchase 3 months' worth of emergency food supplies!



The dedicated kitchen staff, along with our older children who live in our Homes, are working hard to continue feeding everyone on campus.





Children's HOMES

Danita's Children was founded on the principle that every child deserves a safe and loving home to thrive in. Our special needs home is no different. It is currently a forever home for 12 children.

Fifty seven orphaned and abandoned children call Danita's Children their home. In our 7 Children's Homes, they are no longer orphans, but cherished sons and daughters, raised in a loving family environment with house parents and brothers and sisters.







Standing firmly on the foundation that each child is "fearfully and wonderfully made," our special needs home allows children to thrive when others in their community consider them outcasts. Each child is held, sung to, prayed over, and nurtured in countless ways that lets them know they are loved and cherished as special children of God.



Our around-the-clock nursing staff provides loving care while ensuring each child has the appropriate medical attention for their unique need and disability.

Outreach PROGRAM


Currently, our prayer and hope is to reach more children through our Mountain Outreach Program as the need is great.

In 2018, Danita's Children launched a program called Mountain Outreach. While we receive and treat countless children in our Malnutrition Center, we also have a burden for children who never make it to us who live in rural communities. We partner with local nurses and health workers in these rural communities to support and enhance already existing outpatient malnutrition programs.

Every Tuesday, members of our pastoral staff choose different members in the community to visit and pray specifically for the sick and hurting.


