What forms of assistance are available from the State of Michigan?

The MI Bridges site has information on several topics like health care, cash assistance, food assistance, WIC, and much more. The website is www.newmibridges.michigan.gov

On the homepage you will see the heading "What Benefits are Available to You". Scroll down and you will see 6 topics. Click on any/all of them to get details. Scroll further down the homepage, you will see the topic "Need Additional Resources?" Click on the big blue button which is labeled "Find Resources". You will be taken to a page which discusses 15 major life events to learn information about available assistance.

The website is very user friendly. Additionally, you can navigate the website as a guest to see the assistance topics you most need. However, you must open an account to actually avail yourself of any benefits.

PATH: Partnership, Accountability, Training, Hope

A State of Michigan program where the primary focus is to assist participants in reducing their dependence on public assistance and move toward increased self-sufficiency.

Applicants take part in a 21-day assessment period, during which barriers to employment are identified. Caseworkers then assist applicants connect with resources to address these barriers.
