



Colorado's Business Community Comes Out Strong ON BEHALF OF THE OUTDOORS

Team Stewardship Days (TSDs) provide a unique opportunity for the business community to demonstrate their commitment to Colorado's outdoors through active employee engagement. By partnering with VOC, companies can foster tangible, positive change in local communities while bridging the gap between corporate interests and community needs. From Fortune 100 public companies to small mom-and-pop shops, Colorado's business community stepped up this year and collectively provided \$38,002 in donated labor. VOC hosted a record number of TSD projects, and its appetite for impact only grows. Help VOC commemorate 40 years in 2024 by rallying 40 local business groups to champion this cause.

UNYIELDING COMMITMENT

VOC originally partnered with the Boulder Ranger District in 2004 to remove Oxeye Daisy from the James Peak Wilderness area. It has been nearly 20 years of this volunteer-led and coordinated project, and the work hasn’t gone unnoticed; volunteer efforts to remove the invasive species have been so effective that it’s allowed the land managers to hold off on using chemical solutions.




