VOC operates the Outdoor Stewardship Institute (OSI), which offers training courses for VOC volunteers and others to improve their stewardship skills and prepare for a variety of leadership roles.

As an OSI Instructor, you will lead training workshops of 10 – 20 participants and assist in the development, planning, management, presentation, and refinement of training courses. OSI Instructors are responsible for training VOC Crew Leaders in basic trail work, project safety, tools, and leadership skills.
