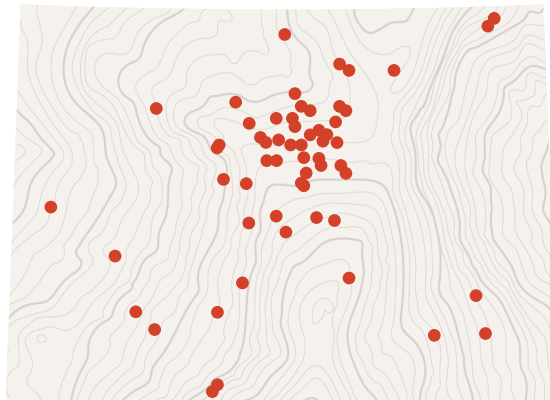

RESTORING RECREATION AREAS

The White River National Forest is the most visited forest in the nation with over 10 million visitors each year, leading to a lot of wear and tear on trails. In partnership with Vail Valley Mountain Trails Alliance (VVMTA), VOC led 53 volunteers in a two-day restoration project on the steep Half Nelson Trail in Minturn. Volunteers worked along a half-mile section to build switchbacks, install drainage structures, and prepare stream crossings. In one weekend, VOC and VVMTA made significant strides in making this popular trail more sustainable, as well as safer for hikers and mountain bikers.

EXPANDING ACCESS THROUGH ASL

An effort ignited by one of VOC's passionate volunteer leaders, Sean Mallory, VOC's pilot project for Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing individuals engaged 12 volunteers who use American Sign Language (ASL) to communicate. These individuals joined over 30 volunteers to restore Red Rock Canyon Open Space in Colorado Springs. Over the course of two days, the crews closed more than a mile of unsanctioned social trails, built 55 timber check dams to stall erosion, and installed 8 feet of fencing to direct hikers away from sensitive areas. We look forward to expanding ASL-supported projects, and our volunteer community, in 2022!

SHARING KNOWLEDGE STATEWIDE

VOC's Outdoor Stewardship Institute (OSI) training courses help volunteers and employees from any organization or agency improve their on-the-ground skills. This year, our OSI offerings expanded with the addition of four certification workshops for both chainsaw and crosscut sawyers. 50 people took part in these trainings, and many continued as volunteer sawyers for VOC! Chainsaws and crosscut saws are critical tools in keeping trails clear of downed trees, removing invasive species such as Russian Olive trees, and thinning forests to mitigate the risk and severity of wildfires. VOC sawyers undertook 10 such projects this year and we look forward to continuing to expand the skillsets of volunteer stewards across the state.

CULTIVATING HEALTHY COMMUNITIES

VOC has partnered with Grow Local Colorado for over 10 years to provide community gardens and fresh, healthy produce for neighbors in need. This year, 75 VOC volunteers helped plant, tend, and harvest five gardens in city parks throughout Denver. These gardens yielded over 4,550 pounds of produce, from tomatoes and peppers to squash and kale, that were donated to organizations that support food security for residents, including Metro Caring, Denver Food Rescue, The Gathering Place, and others.

ENGAGING THE NEXT GENERATION

While the pandemic put a hiatus on our youth programs in 2020, this year we were able to welcome back our young volunteers! Over 80% of our public volunteer projects were open to minors this season (including 17% of projects open to kids ages 12 or younger), and we saw 131 children and teenagers come out to help care for Colorado's outdoor places. We also restarted our award-winning Cairn Youth Program, which will engage 18 high school students in monthly activities throughout the 2021-2022 school year. Stay tuned for our 2022 volunteer schedule, which will include the return of our signature Family Camping and Young Stewards projects!

STEWARDING CORPORATE IMPACT

VOC's Corporate SWAT (Stewardship with a Team) program provides organizations of all sizes the opportunity to give back to the places where their employees live, work, and play. The 26 employees worked together to re-stain a large boardwalk, irrigate and mulch pollinator gardens, and build a new fence. ADVANCING OUTDOOR CAREERS

VOC's Grossman Scholarship Program was established in 2018 to help make educational dreams possible for those who have demonstrated a commitment to caring for the environment. The scholarship, funded by former VOC Board Member Rick Grossman and his wife Susie, has since awarded \$70,000 to 14 Colorado students to pursue degrees related to environmental, natural resource, climate, or outdoor industry-related work. This year, the Grossmans generously doubled the scholarship. VOC now offers two \$10,000 scholarships and four \$5,000 scholarships each year!

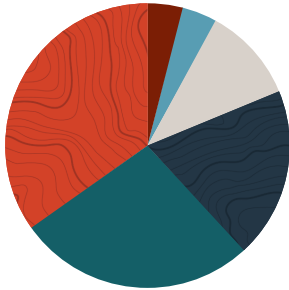

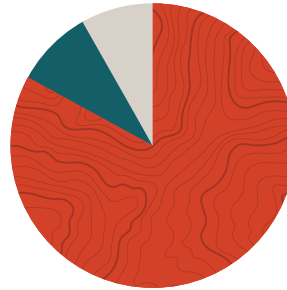
