Sunday 9 November – HSNT 7th Annual Oration at History House – Speaker Dr Wendy GardenWendy obtained her doctorate from the University of Melbourne. She is Head of Audience, Education &
Learning at the Museum & Art Gallery of the NT and is President of the Australian Museums & Galleries
Association, NT Branch. Her research and writing interests have focused on photographic portraiture in India
and Australia and the photomedia reinterpretations of nineteenth century photographs by contemporary
artists.

Wendy's talk is titled "Capturing time past and present: the McArthur River Mine in visual representation"

The expansion of the McArthur River mine cut the tail of the Rainbow Serpent in half, poisoned the surrounding waterways, the town camp water supply and caused the death of 400 cattle.

Aggrieved by the contamination of his ancestral lands, Garrwa elder Jack Green created confronting paintings that brought attention to the environmental damage caused by the mine. He enlisted Darwin based artist Therese Ritchie to create portrait photographs of people from Borroloola who were affected by the ecological threat. The exhibition *Open Cut* opened at the Northern Centre for Contemporary Art in 2017 followed by the online exhibition *Lead in My Grandmother's Body* in 2020.

This led to collaborations between Green, Ritchie, Garrwa/Yanyuwa artist Nancy McDinny, Garrwa/Gangalidda artist Stewart Hoosan and anthropologist Sean Kerins. Their exhibitions drew upon oral histories of settlement to contrast the fast violence of colonial dispossession with the slow violence of environmental poisoning.

With the permission from the artists, Dr Wendy Garden will discuss and show a selection of the photographs.

Our Oration will be held at History House, 1/16 Charlton Court, Woolner at 3pm.

Everyone is welcome to attend. Nibbles and drinks will follow the talk.
