Sunday 14 May (Mother's Day) 11.30am - 12.15pm - Celebrate - Granny Lum Loy - A true Territorian at the Museum & Art Gallery Theatrette

The celebrations will begin with a talk by MAGNT Assistant Curator of Territory History, Paige Taylor, who will present just some of the hundreds of Chinese objects held in the MAGNT Territory History Collection.

Followed by Talk - A true Territorian: Portrait of Grandma Lum Loy - 12.30pm - 12.50pm

MAGNT Senior Curator of Art, Bryony Nainby, will discuss the 1979 Archibald prize finalist painting, A true Territorian: Portrait of Grandma Lum Loy painted by Geoff La Gerche who was dubbed an 'eyeball realist' for his super-scaled portraits. Following formal studies in Melbourne, La Gerche spent years in London at the Royal College of Art before returning to Australia. In 1979, he took up an artist residency in Darwin, which is where he produced this portrait.

Followed by Talk - Granny Lum Loy, the Matriarch of Darwin's Chinese Community - 1pm-2pm

Descendants of Granny Lum Loy and some of her close friends will discuss her life and the lasting impacts she had on the Darwin Chinese community including a presentation by Dr Natalie Fong on a little-known aspect of Granny Lum Loy's life and the concept of mui tsai (imported maids) in Australia. Speakers Elizabeth Kwan, Roland Chin and former Administrator of the NT, Ted Egan AO, will discuss elements of Granny Lum Loy's life with host former Chief Minister, Clare Martin AO. And of course, Ted Egan will perform his famous song written about Granny Lum Loy!

Newcastle Waters - Junction Hotel Repairs

Last year Newcastle Waters Station (owned by Consolidated Pastoral Company) received a grant of \$10,000 through the NT Heritage Grants Program to undertake repairs to the Junction Hotel.

The NT Government Heritage Branch offers these grants via the Department of Territory Families by application on an annual basis.

Within the heritage-listed Newcastle Waters Historic Township, a number of properties are privately owned by Consolidated Pastoral Company (CPC), including the Junction Hotel and adjacent lots.

Over two very hot days, staff from Newcastle Waters Station worked on the Junction Hotel and surrounding grounds and buildings.

The National Trust owned Jones Store have also received a \$8,500.00 grant for much-needed roofing repairs.
