Saturday 27 May 10am-11am - Audio Tour Launch | Fannie Bay Gaol: On the Inside You are invited to unlock Darwin's early prison history through a new immersive audio experience.

The Museum and Art Gallery of the Northern Territory are launching their new app Fannie Bay Gaol: On the Inside

This is a powerful, narrative-driven tour that shares untold stories of the Northern Territory's longest running prison which opened in 1883 and closed in 1979.

Recorded binaurally, the tour features immersive 3D stereo sound recorded with the help of dozens of Darwin locals at Fannie Bay Gaol.

Newcastle Waters Historic Township Master Plan


The TourismNT funded document provides a wonderful foundation for future planning (subject to funding) for the heritage listed Newcastle Waters Historical Township.




The book was launched on International Nurses Day by His Honour, Professor Hugh Heggie, NT Administrator.

New Publication by Derek Pugh - Darwin, Survival of a City The 1890s

Modern Darwin is a young city in an ancient land. It is a beautiful, vibrant tropical city dubbed the 'Pearl of the Arafura'. But It wasn't always so nice. Derek Pugh's series on the settlement of the Top End and the early history of Darwin tells the true story, warts and all, of this most distant of South Australian settlements and its extraordinary characters. A city young enough to be photographed from its very first days, each book is well illustrated using those photographs.

The final book in the series, "Darwin, Survival of a City The 1890s" recalls the last last decade of the nineteenth century. It was a tough time for South Australia's Top End settlement of Palmerston. The major industries of mining, pastoralism, and agriculture suffered from downturn, disease, and distance. The South Australians had had enough of their 'white elephant' and, when Palmerston blew away in the Great Hurricane of 1897, the calls for the Territory's return to the British Colonial Government grew louder.

But the Territory, as ever, was full of resilient and resourceful characters. They appear in these pages: judges, railway gangers, bushmen, murderers, buffalo hunters, hoteliers, Chinese miners, Aboriginal station hands, explorers, cross-country cyclists, murderers, and more

Territorians were, as Banjo Patterson described them, full of 'booze, blow and blasphemy' – but even he couldn't wait to get back.


