FUTURE EVENTS

Display - Overland Telegraph Line at the NT Library - on display until 27 November

To commemorate the 150th anniversary of the joining of the Overland Telegraph Line, Library & Archives NT has developed a small display, 'Along the Wire'.

Showcasing some of the objects used to construct and operate the line, together with key photographs and documents this display provides a glimpse into the technological feat which connected the Australian colonies with the rest of the world, changing communication forever.

Exhibition - Shifting Tides at the NT Library - on display until 30 October

Shifting Tides brings together woodblock prints of Darwin Harbour by Northern Territory artist Jacqueline F Gribbin.

Referencing maritime charts from the collection of Library & Archives NT, the exhibition considers the navigational challenges faced by vessels moving within the harbour, the ebbs and flows of tides and the ambience generated by the harbour's changing weather.

Curator floor talks will be held at 11.30am on Friday 26 August and Friday 21 October. These talks have been made possible by the Australian Government's Regional Arts Fund, which supports the arts in regional and remote Australia.

Thursday 1 September - Talk on Cyclone Tracy - Museum & Art Gallery at 11am

Cyclone Tracy struck Darwin on Christmas Eve 1974 leaving behind 66 dead, hundreds wounded, and a city destroyed. Join Jared Archibald, Curator of Territory History for a guided tour of the Cyclone Tracy exhibition and gain insights into one of Australia's worst natural disasters, stories of the people that were affected by it, and how the museum has attempted to interpret this historic event.

Register at the Information Desk in the Foyer from 10:45am.

Meet in the foyer at 11:00am then proceed to the exhibition with the curator.

Participants should be aware this tour will move through the exhibition space with little opportunity to sit or rest. Food and beverage, including bottled water, is not permitted inside our galleries. Please stow your snacks and drink bottles in a locker behind the Information Desk.

Tuesday 6 September - talk by Derek Pugh at the NT Archives, Millner at 5.30-6.30pm 'A Journey on the Overland Telegraph Line'.

On the 150th anniversary of the Overland Telegraph Line, Derek has written a book, and is working on a film to promote the history of this most important infrastructure event of the nineteenth century. Both are titled 'Twenty to the Mile'.

In 1872, communication between London and Australia went from seven months to seven hours. Morse code changed the lives of Britain's far-flung colonists, and the Overland Telegraph Line – built by Charles Todd and hundreds of men in just over two years – was integral to Australia's international success and the establishment of the Territory.

Stretching 3,000 km between Port Augusta and Port Darwin it used 36,000 poles, 11 repeater stations and a host of pioneering telegraph station masters and support teams.

The OTL was built just 10 years after the explorer John McDouall Stuart's successful south to north crossing of the continent.

Winners will be announced and presented their awards at the Ceremony


Friday 23 September - National Trust talk at Burnett House 6.30pm for 7pm start


