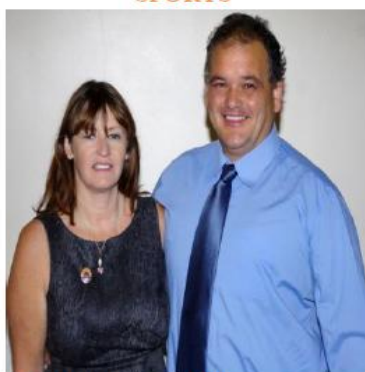

Rallying on Club Sites for 2026

- One booking will be made for the whole rally. Each pitch will be booked with a unique stay reference and will reside within the booking.
- Bookings will be made under the name of the Centre who will exist as a Membership within the Club system.
- All passenger details, including number of people (adults and children), and a lead name per party will be required to secure the booking and must be provided before 28 days of the start date of the rally.
- Full payment of all pitches will be required to secure the booking by 21 days before the start of the rally. A single payment must be made by the lead organiser of the rally by BACS to the Club. Card payments may be accepted in some circumstances by contacting the Club directly. Cash or cheque payments are no longer accepted.
- If no confirmation and no payment is received by 21 days prior to arrival, the CAMC reserves the right to release the pitches back to general sale and assume that the rally is no longer required.
- Participants of Centre rallies are assumed to be members of the Club, therefore no non-member supplements will be applied.
- Booking changes less than or equal to 21 days prior to arrival* - A £5 cancellation fee will apply to any reduction of nights, pitches, or passengers. Pitches can be transferred to another party free of charge. Please notify the Club as soon as possible if this is required.
- Booking changes post arrival to site* - A 100% cancellation fee will apply to any reduction of nights, pitches or passengers if guests need to curtail their stay in any way.

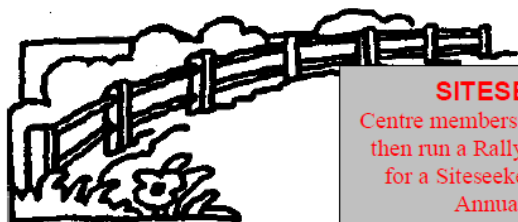

SITSEEKER PLAQUE

Centre members who locate a new venue and then run a Rally at the location will qualify for a Siteseeker Plaque (presented at the Annual General Meeting)

GENERAL NOTES AND RULES FOR RALLY-GOERS

BOOKING - Rally Officers are volunteers, and you can assist by sending the appropriate Rally booking slip together with the non-returnable deposit if required, a MINIMUM OF SEVEN DAYS prior to the start of the Rally. If after booking, you are unable to attend the Rally you should notify the Rally Officers (or their assistants) as soon as possible. You will be held responsible for any expenses incurred on your behalf. In the event of a Rally being cancelled, or a necessary last minute change of venue, only those members who have booked in will be notified, and at the same time, informed of any alternative arrangements.

LIMITED RALLIES - Venues may of necessity be limited with regard to number of caravans and/or persons. You are therefore, advised to book early, to avoid disappointment.

SIGNS - Look out for Dyfed Centre (Orange) direction signs when approaching the Rally location.

BREAKDOWN - If you should break down on your way to or from the Rally, display a red warning triangle. This will indicate to other Rally-goers that you require help.

ON ARRIVAL - You must immediately report to the Rally Officers (or their assistants) and await siting instructions. **ALL RALLIES COMMENCE AT 5.00 p.m. (unless otherwise advertised) AND YOU MUST NOT ARRIVE BEFORE THIS TIME.** Rallies end at 6.00 p.m. (unless otherwise advertised) and you must not embarrass the Rally Officers (or their assistants) by seeking to extend your stay.

IDENTITY - You must be prepared to produce your current CAMC membership card upon request from the Rally Officers (or their assistants) or a member of the Committee. Sub-letting or lending your caravan is not permitted on Rallies. Only holders of CAMC family membership cards may occupy the caravan when the full member is not present on the Rally.

SAVING PLACES ON RALLIES - You are permitted to save one place upon arrival at the Rally. Members wishing to be sited together should arrive at the same time. Any additional places which you desire to save may only be kept, after prior consultation with the Rally Officers (or their assistants).

PAYMENT TO RALLY OFFICERS - Please try and avoid paying by cheque, as this causes a cashflow problem. When deposits are paid by cheque they must be made payable to 'THE CARAVAN CLUB - DYFED CENTRE'.

SITE FEE - This is the amount payable to the landowners for the use of their facilities, etc.

RALLY FEE - This includes VAT at the current rate, and goes towards the cost of your competition/slip prizes, sweets (for children 12 years and under), maintenance of Rally equipment, Centre overheads, coffee, tea, etc. and other Rally expenses.

SOCIAL AND SPECIAL EVENTS - When these are organised by the Rally Officers (or their assistants), or the Committee, it is hoped that you will support them. You may be asked to pay an extra charge, if so, this will usually be indicated on upon your arrival at the Rally.



SAFETY - A MINIMUM of 10 metres (thirteen paces) must be maintained between caravans (peg to peg). 15 metres (seventeen paces) must be maintained between rows (peg to peg).

SLOPING SITE - Some Rally venues may be slightly sloping, and you are strongly recommended to carry suitable levelling blocks at all times.

LATE ARRIVALS - If you arrive after 10.30 p.m. you must site yourself temporarily at a suitable point, and on the following morning, report to the Rally Officers (or their assistants) for pitching instructions. No arrivals after 8 p.m. on CAMC Sites.

PLAQUE - This will only be available for holiday rallies and special occasions (subject to demand).

WATER - Mains drinking water will nearly always be available from a tap on the Rally field. If you are in any doubt about its purity, you should boil it first. No part of a chemical toilet should be washed at the drinking water tap (to avoid possible contamination). Waste Water should be disposed of in (not over) hedgerows, if no disposable point is available.

SANITATION - Every caravan must have its own chemical toilet. Disposal facilities will be provided for you to empty it periodically. If only one water tap is available in the Rally field, a separate water container must be used to carry water for filling and washing out your chemical toilet.

RUBBISH - At weekend Rallies no arrangements may be available for dry rubbish disposal, so be prepared to take it home. On departure, please ensure that your pitch is left clean and tidy.

INCLEMENT WEATHER - The Rally Officer (or their assistants) and the Committee are empowered to restrict the movement of vehicles on the Rally field during bad weather. Towing by tractor and four-wheel drive vehicles may sometimes be necessary to avoid damage to the ground. All tows will be at your own risk, and no responsibility for damage to your outfit will be accepted by the owners or driver of the towing vehicle, the Dyfed Centre, the CAMC or landowners. You will be responsible for hitching and unhitching your own caravan to the towing vehicle. To help cover the towing vehicle owner's costs, a minimum donation of £1.00 should be offered, at the time of the tow.

YELLOW FLAG - This will be flown under the Centre flag during inclement weather, when the Rally Officers (or their assistants) consider it necessary to stop the movement of vehicles. This is to prevent excessive damage to the ground. Members and their visitors must not take vehicles on or off the Rally venue. Only at the discretion of the Rally Officers (or their assistants) will the BLUE disability badge override the yellow flag.

DRONES - All drones must be flown away from the rally field and must not overfly the caravan lines.

CHILDREN - You are responsible for the conduct, supervision and safety of your own children (and visitors children), at all times, and for ensuring that no damage is occasioned, either on or off the Rally field. Children (and adults) are not permitted to ride bicycles in the caravan lines or near towing vehicles. Dangerous toys, catapults, guns, etc., are not permitted. Ball games and kite flying must take place well away from all caravans, towing vehicles and overhead cables. BICYCLES MUST NOT EXCEED 5m.p.h.

OPEN FIRES AND FIREPITS - These are not allowed on any part of the rally field. No exceptions.

ANIMALS - These must be kept under the full control of a responsible person at all times, to ensure no annoyance is caused to landowners or other Rally-goers. Dogs must be kept on leads, by hand or at Caravan not exceeding 3 metres in length and they must be exercised WELL CLEAR of caravans and towing vehicles, and ideally around the perimeter of the Rally field, or some other suitable location. It is a condition that your dog(s) must have been treated against tapeworm.

GENERATORS - May only be used between the hours of 09.00 am and 8.00 pm and must not be left unattended.

NOISE - From televisions, radios, parties, etc., **MUST BE KEPT TO A MINIMUM AFTER 11.00 p.m.** Please spare a thought for your neighbours. Persistent offenders will be asked to leave the Rally field.

TENTS - Tents are allowed on the rallies over 5 days by agreement of the designated Rally Officer and in line with current Caravan and Motorhome Club rules. The Rally Officers decision to allow or not is final.

VISITORS - If you invite visitors to any Rally, please tell them to report to the Rally Officers (or their assistants) immediately upon arrival. They can then be directed to you, with the minimum of inconvenience.

EMERGENCY EQUIPMENT - Your caravan must be equipped with a first aid kit and a fire extinguisher. It is your responsibility to ensure that extinguishers are kept in full working order.

DRIVING - Only persons possessing a full driving licence are permitted to drive motor vehicles on the Rally field. **VEHICLES MUST NOT EXCEED 5mph.** Learner drivers are not permitted, including those on motor cycles. You must also advise any of your visitors of this rule. The 5 mph rule also applies to bicycles.

BARBECUES - You must obtain permission from the Rally Officers (or their assistants) before lighting up. There may be a reason for not doing so, of which you may not be aware. Barbecues must not be lit inside awnings, close to awnings, caravans or towing vehicles. Have consideration for your neighbours as wrongly sited barbecues can cause offence.

RALLY HANDBOOK - The Centre Officers and Committee reserve the right to alter or amend any items in this Rally Handbook, including Site Fees, without prior notice. If you have not rallied for some time, you are advised to check with the Rally Secretary for up-to-date information.

DISCLAIMER - All persons attending Rallies, social events, etc., do so entirely at their own risk. No responsibility for persons or property is accepted by the organisers or the Caravan and Motorhome Club.

COMPLAINTS - If you have a legitimate complaint, you should report it in the first instance to the Rally Officers (or their assistants) or to a member of the Centre's Committee at the time, for action if thought necessary, or alternatively in writing, for discussion by the Committee at its next meeting. All Centre Officers and Committee display name plaques in the front window of their caravans, and invite you to discuss any caravanning problem with them.

GENERAL - The Centre Officers and Committee delegate responsibility for the running and organisation of the Rally to the appointed Rally Officers (and their assistants). They are volunteers who, as a token of appreciation to other Rally Officers and assistants, devote one (or more) weekend to run a Rally for your enjoyment. Please remember that the sudden arrival of caravans within a few hours usually draws attention in the locality. Don't forget to observe the 'Caravan and Country Codes' (as detailed in the Club Sites Directory and Handbook) which you undertook to abide by, when you joined the Caravan and Motorhome Club.

AND FINALLY - The use of a Rally venue is a privilege, and it is your responsibility to ensure that these 'Notes and Rules for Rally-goers' are observed, in order to uphold the good name of the Caravan and Motorhome Club and the Dyfed Centre. By doing this, it should ensure our welcome return to the vicinity on future occasions.

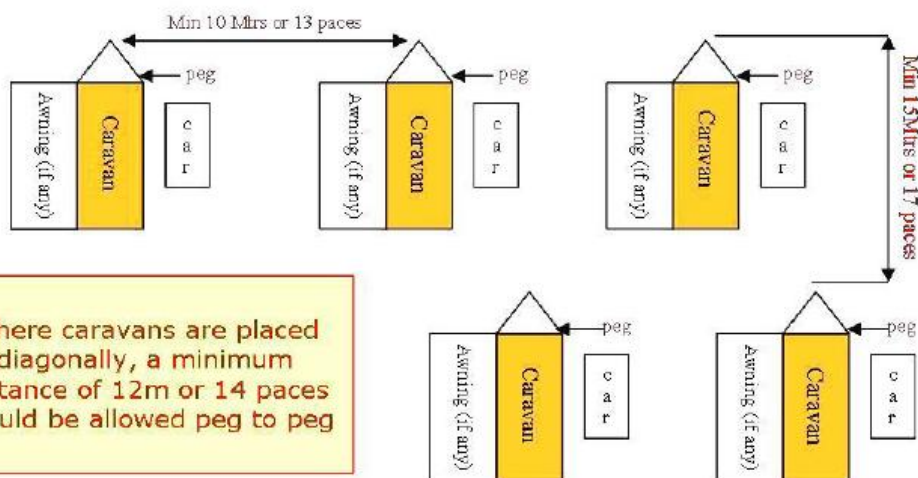

CENTRE COMPETITION RULES

ILLUMINATED WINDOW

12-volt electrical supply only allowed for the display.

DARTS

Open to mixed couples (Dyfed members and their families only) who must attend the designated Rally. The Lady member of the team to throw the nearest to the Bull. 3 legs of 401. Flying start, double finish. If both teams are drawn to double one, the scorer will ask all four players to have one throw each, at the double one, i.e. three darts per player. If the double is not achieved, Lady members of both teams will throw one dart for the nearest to the Bull. From the start of the competition to the Final, all games will be 401, 3 legs.

OWNERS IMPROVEMENT

A single improvement, inside or outside the Caravan. The work must have been carried out by the owner of the Caravan, who must attend the designated Rally. The entry will be judged on purpose, function, design and workmanship. An improvement to the towing vehicle will not be considered.

WINEMAKING

One bottle per adult attending the designated Rally. Winner to be judged on a points system, marked and sampled by the members attending the Rally. All entries must be submitted before the advertised closing time for the competition.

CRAFT COMPETITION

The Dyfed Centre has introduced a new craft competition. Open to all members of the Dyfed Centre, entries can consist of any homemade craft item, e.g., cushion, card, needlework, etc. The theme will be published in the handbook in the notes field of the designated craft rally and members entering the competition must attend the designated rally. An independent judge will be appointed.

RALLY HANDBOOK COVER

Limited to one entry per person, and must be on an official entry form. Any amount of colour to be used. Where photocopied photographs are used, the original prints (black and white or colour) must be available if required. The official CAMC logo must be used. Cartoons, sketches or deliberate free hand text, should be sufficient quality for direct reproduction. The winning entry becomes the property of Dyfed Centre, and the current Committee reserve the right to make any necessary adjustments for the purpose of publication of the handbook. The winning entry will automatically go forward to the Caravan and Motorhome Club National Competition. *Entries must reach the Hon. Secretary by the 2nd Sunday of September*

PHOTOGRAPHIC

The best colour photograph (maximum size 7" x 5") of anything re. Caravanning (limited to 2 entries per person). Photographs must be titled, and bear the name of the entrant on the rear of each entry. The photographs must have been taken in the twelve months preceding the closing date of the competition. The Junior Photographic Competition is open to members' children, 12 years and under. *Entries for both competitions must reach the Hon. Secretary by the 2nd Sunday of September*

BARBEQUE

Barbeque competition will take place at the designated rally as detailed in the handbook. Any theme allowed and will be judged by a tasting by all members attending the rally.

3. Only metal boules of 70mm to 80mm diameter and weight not exceeding 800 grammes will be used. Marker ball (Cachonnet) will be 25mm to 30mm diameter
4. Pitch dimensions will be 12m long and 2m wide
5. The starting team is decided by the toss of a coin, one member of the team chooses the starting place and draws a line on the ground. Both feet must stay behind the line when throwing the boule
6. The first thrower throws the marker ball between 6m and 10m from the line and within the playing pitch
7. The player from the first team throws the boule, followed by the player for the second team. The boule closest to the marker ball takes the lead, the other team then throw their boules until they get closer to the marker ball and take the lead. When the non-leading team has no more boules, the players from the leading team throw their remaining boules
8. When both teams have no more boules the points are counted. The winning team is awarded as many points as it has boules nearer to the marker ball than the best boule of the losing team
9. A player of the winning team throws the marker ball from that end to start the next game
10. Alternate ends are played until one team reaches 13 points, when the leg will be awarded
11. Preliminary rounds will consist of one leg; quarter finals through to and including the final, will consist of the best of three legs
12. Only boules within the playing area will be counted - boundary lines form part of the playing area
13. A measurement will be taken for any distance that cannot be judged by the naked eye. The referee's decision will be final
