Rules and Regulations

- 1 Eligibility This competition shall be open to amateur golfers who are members of a recognised Golf Club, and shall be played in accordance with the Rules of Golf as approved by the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews, and in accordance with local course rules. Age restriction 16yrs on or before registration day.
- 2 Handicap Ladies play from the RED Tee Markers and the Gents from the WHITE Tee Markers. The handicap limit is 24 for Gentlemen and 32 for Ladies. Handicap certificates must be provided. Higher handicaps will compete off the above.
- 3 Distance Measuring Devices Players are permitted to use devices that measure distance only. Devices that are capable of gauging or measuring other conditions are not permitted. Use of such a device will result in a penalty of disqualification.
- 4 Buggy Policy The use of buggies will only be permitted for medical reasons and with prior consent of the committee. A Medical Certificate will be required.
- 5 Dress Code All courses operate a strict dress code. Please check with the individual courses to ensure that these are adhered to.
- 6 Prizes Monetary prizes in the form of SG Vouchers will be awarded to the best 4 Scores in the Scratch Section and to the best 4 Scores in the Handicap Section. A daily prize will be awarded on each day of the competition. Competitors who win overall Scratch or Handicap Prizes will not be eligible to win a Daily Prize, and only 1 Daily Prize in total will be awarded per pair during the week.
 - The Scratch Trophy will be awarded to the pair returning the lowest gross aggregate score and the Handicap Trophy will be awarded to the pair returning the lowest nett aggregate score. Were one pair to return both the lowest gross and nett scores, the Handicap Trophy would be awarded to the pair returning the second lowest nett score. In the event of a tie the trophies will be awarded to the pair returning the lower home course round score. Should there still be a tie the winner will be decided by the last 9 holes of the home course round, then the last 6 holes, the last 3 holes or the last hole. If at this point both pairs are still tied each will be awarded a trophy.
 - All prizes will be calculated and awarded at the end of the competition.
- 7 The Competition The Competition will comprise of 5 rounds of 18 holes played over 5 different courses in 4 Ball Better Ball format. The scoring system each day will be Strokeplay. If play is suspended due to inclement weather (horn or siren will sound), players should mark their balls and return to the clubhouse immediately. In the event of cancellation of any day's golf at any course, the overall winners will be decided upon over the remaining number of courses played. Competitors will be offered a free round of golf at the affected course(s) to be taken within 12 months. No monetary refunds will be given. The decision of the Organising Committee will be final.

Format of Play

Four Ball Better Ball - Ladies Handicaps will have the SSS adjustment added before having the handicap allowance applied. Each player will receive a handicap allowance of 85% of their playing handicap. Each player plays their own ball. A GROSS score MUST be entered on the score card. Players are encouraged to pick up their ball should they find that they won't score at the hole. Ladies play from the RED tee markers and gents from the WHITE tee markers. All players will use their own Par and Stroke Index.

The Alyth Club consists of the original 18 hole Alyth Course and the new addition of the 9 hole Glenisla Course. The Alyth Course (6259 yards, Par 70) is a combination of tree lined fairways and rolling terrain, the course presents a delightful challenge as it meanders through the avenues of pines and silver birch, requiring accuracy over length off the tee. However, both are required at the long par 4, 9th and 10th holes, and the Par 5, 11th. A fun course to play, it was recently voted Scotland's "Best Course Under £50", at The Scottish Golf Tourism Awards. In 2016, the Club took on the back 9 holes of the original Glenisla course, creating a challenging 9 hole course (3078 yards, Par 35) with the option to play 18 holes from different tees (6229 yards, par 70).

Blairgowrie Golf Club boasts 3 fine golf courses. The Lansdowne Course, (7007 yard, Par 72) was designed by Peter Alliss and Dave Thomas in 1979 and has hosted a number of events including most recently, the Scottish Amateur Championship in 2013 and the PGA Championship Finals in 2014. Routed through swathes of pine and silver birch trees, it requires much more accuracy from the tee than the much older Rosemount Course (6630 yard, Par 72) which hosted the Junior Ryder Cup in 2014, and was the venue of Greg Norman's first European Tour victory in the 1970's. The Rosemount and Lansdowne courses are complimented by The Wee Course (2327 yard, Par 32) which is one of the most fun and enjoyable 9 hole courses to be found anywhere in Scotland.

Forfar Golf Club has the 4th oldest 18 hole course in the world and is the very first Club to have an 18 hole course from inception and inauguration. In 1871, Founding member James Brodie invited Tom Morris Snr to Forfar where he laid out an 18-hole golf course. This was the very first 18-hole course built from inception anywhere in the world.

The unique topography with undulating furrows makes for a demanding test. Favour accuracy over distance and take careful note of pin positions, there's some blind shots!

With 87 bunkers on the course you must think your way round. The greens have many subtle burrows so endeavour to finish below the hole. James Braid put his name to the 15th, regarding it his best design.

James Braid created this exquisite gem (5518 yard, Par 70), a glorious mix of heathland and parkland which rests perfectly on a hillside and against the spectacular backdrop of the Angus Glens.

Although short by modern standards, the course boasts its fair share of obstacles including the 180 yard par 3, 17th hole which is surrounded by mature trees, and the uphill 18th which is blocked on the right fairway by a magnificent large oak. But the breathtaking scenery may well prove your greatest distraction.

The warmest of welcomes awaits every visitor to Strathmore, which is beautifully set amidst the glorious Perthshire countryside, overlooking the Strathmore Valley and Sidlaw Hills. Opened in 1996, the facilities include the impressive John Salvesen designed 18 hole Rannaleroch Course (6454 yard, Par 72) and the 9 hole Leitfie Links (166 yd par 29), driving range, large short game practice area, putting green, and a beautifully appointed clubhouse, making it a popular spot for golfing and non-golfing visitors alike. The fairways are relatively generous, but watch out for the many undulations on the greens which may make putting trickier than you first expect!
