During the service, questions were posed to Ali that are important ones for us all to consider and reflect upon. We may be tempted to believe that these questions apply only to ordained and called ministers of the church.

However, as members of a community of faith, these questions can lead us into deeper contemplation of our relationship to God and to each other. It's true that none of us have a formal 'ministry', but we each have work that we are called to do: a paid job, volunteer work, caring for family, serving at Trinity. And while Ali has a specific set of people that she has been called to care for, we each have been called by the gospel of Jesus to love and serve others.

Questions for our reflection:

- Will you carry out your ministry by **following the teachings of the Bible and the Lutheran church?**
- Will you **continue learning** about God and the Bible and **stay faithful** in worship, prayer, and the sacraments?
- Trusting that God cares for you, will you **share Jesus' love** through your words and actions, **pray** for all of God's people, find ways to **grow in love** for the people you serve, and **sharpen your skills** through learning and practice?

The good news is that Almighty God, who has given us the will to do these things, graciously gives us the strength and compassion to perform them!


2026 Lenten Pledge: Random Acts of Kindness

Congregational Meeting February 1

A few highlights from the meeting:

- Election of New Council Members: Janet Fontaine, Beth Keenan, Anne Meibohm were elected to serve on Council (3 year terms); Georgia Burnett was elected to serve as an alternate (1 year term).
- Representatives to Synod Assembly in May: Judy Flanigan and Janet Fontaine were approved to represent Trinity as voting members.
- Pastor Karen Nelson, in brief remarks, said she is very grateful for being a part of this community of faith. She hopes that the congregation sees what she sees: a vibrant, thriving community filled with joy and optimism – a resurrection place. She looks forward to what we do together next.
- David Stone, Treasurer and chair of the Finance Committee, reviewed income and expenses for 2025 and presented the 2026 budget which was approved unanimously by the congregation.
- The Pave the Way Campaign has received pledges of \$133,400; \$107,000 has been received. The amount of the outstanding pledges is \$28,800. The remaining pledge money is due by April 19, 2026.
