

Embracing change by Rev Bryan Penman, Bishop of the Southeastern PA Synod

Change can be hard...but when we keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, we discover again and again that God equips us to do more than we ever thought possible.

Notes from the September Council Meeting by Mike Martorelli

- In addition to performing her regular duties, Pastor Karen has presided over a wedding, a funeral, and a local ELCA Pastors meeting. She has also been working on the Trinity Directory (with photos) and on events involving contemplative photography, Ken Crest, Ann Lamott, and the American Dancewheels.
- Finance is asking all committee chairs to submit their financial requests for inclusion in the 2026 budget. Dave Stone noted that our weekly flower bill is being raised to \$60 and hopes that all contributors will pick up that additional cost.
- Karl Schafer summarized Ron Moorehead's busy activity level. We need a new air conditioning unit, and a new fire alarm communications device. Additionally, we need to cut down three dead trees. Karl is working to procure the shade structure for the Mary Setzer Memorial and will be working with Ron to organize a group of volunteers to assemble and install it on the playground hopefully by the spring of 2026.
- TCNSK enrollment is 84, as compared to 82 last year. Everyone will be invited to another Live Nativity event on December 5.
- Emma Berkmire and Nancy Klein staffed an information table at the Worcester Community Day. Next year, we'll explore having a table at other

local townships' similar events.

- Marilou Doughty noted that we'll again be collecting blankets for Daily Bread and stuffed animals for Gemma

New Books in the Library

In advance of Nadia Bolz-Weber's speaking engagement at Trinity Lutheran Church in Lansdale on October 6, our library has added two of her books to our collection. The publisher's descriptions are included below.

Accidental Saints

In *Accidental Saints, New York Times* best-selling author Nadia Bolz-Weber invites readers into a surprising encounter with what she calls "a religious but not-so-spiritual life." Tattooed, angry and profane, this former standup comic turned pastor stubbornly, sometimes hilariously, resists the God she feels called to serve. But God keeps showing up in the least likely of people.

Pastrix: The Cranky, Beautiful Faith of a Sinner & Saint

Nadia Bolz-Weber uses humorous narrative and poignant honesty to portray a woman who is both deeply faithful and deeply flawed, giving hope to the rest of us along the way. ("Pastrix" is a derogatory term used by Christians who refuse to recognize female pastors.)
