- Peanut Butter & Jelly Sandwiches. We meet monthly to make PB & J sandwiches to deliver to the Sisters of Charity in Norristown for their soup

In addition to these charitable acts, we can also work for justice.**LamPA**, the Lutheran Advocacy Ministry of Pennsylvania, has ways for us to be involved.

"As people of faith, when we pray for our daily bread, we ask not just for ourselves, but for our neighbors," says Tracey DePasquale, of LamPA. "We know that food is essential to life -- and for those already on the margins, these cumulative cuts can be life-threatening. We also know that while we are moved in this season of government disruption to be even more charitable, we are also especially called to strive for justice -- and that requires advocacy with and on behalf of those who are suffering and in need.
