MASS MINUTES

I remember, as an 18 year old, going with my father to Holy Name Society meetings at our parish. The primary goal of The Holy Name Society was “...to beget due love and reverence for the Holy Name of God and Jesus Christ.” In other words, it was fighting the profanity involving the sacred names.
The second commandment is, “You shall not take the name of the Lord, your God, in vain.” (Deu. 5:11) “Respect for his name is an expression of the respect owed to the mystery of God himself.” (CCC 2144)
The names of God and Jesus are used many times during the Mass and you may notice some people bow their heads at the mention of those names and, perhaps, of Mary. This is a response to the instruction of St. Paul regarding the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus: Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name above every name, that at the name of Jesus, every knee shall bend in heaven on the earth, and under the earth and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God, the Father.” (Phil 2:9-10)

THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME
In this Sunday’s Gospel, Jesus says: “Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men. “ As disciples, we are called to continue God’s work on earth. Taking care of God’s poor is indeed living Gospel values.



St. James (2:14-26) makes the case that how one acts—their “works” are a sign of “faith” they possess. So called—“faith” which doesn’t lead a person to participate in good works is not a saving faith; it is a dead thing.

Your support of St. Vincent de Paul and the “friends in need” that we serve, whether by **prayer and/or material help** is certainly one sign of your “good works” and your “faith”. **Good works is a necessary consequence of a faith –filled heart.**

We are shown to be right with God by what we do, not by faith alone. (James 2:24) The works a person does are the proof of the nature of their faith.

The frigid temps have brought on more urgency to the needs of our homeless friends. Our Conference continues to work very hard to meet these needs with whatever resources we can access. Remember them in your prayers. Thank you for your continued support! May God’s blessings come upon you in abundance. **“Those who are happiest are those who do the most for others.”**
