Each weekend a collection is taken up at the time we call Offertory. In conversations one might hear complaints, and there are many jokes, about the frequency of special collections "The Church is always asking for money."

We must remember, first, that we are the church. Secondly, we have many bills to pay at home and so do we have at Church. For thousands of years there was a Temple Tax to support the place of worship, the place where God resided, the place of the Ark of the Covenant, God's footstool.

More important, though, than the material needs is the need for the faithful to offer themselves to their creator. We do this by offering the work of our hands. In AD 155, Justin Martyr described the custom of people bringing bread and wine to the priest. This developed into the practice of a representative of the people bring, in addition to the bread and wine, oil, honey, wool, fruit, wax, or flowers. (Dr. Edward Sri)

Please pray for the poor and suffering, knowing that you are bringing the love and peace of Jesus to those who live in fear, doubt, loneliness and dread. As Vincentians, we are sometimes asked why we help some

who do not "deserve" it. Our response is: "The Undeserving Poor"

The undeserving poor are the ones who make it hard to help the poor. They are the ones who have been helped before and it didn't help. They are the ones who seem to expect us to bail them out, and who hardly say thank you when we do. They are the ones who seem to take advantage of the system, or other people. **HELP THEM ANYWAY!**

If you start to distinguish between the deserving and the undeserving poor, you are finished—at least as far as the Gospel is concerned. Who is really to decide if they are undeserving? Jesus was never overly careful about metering out his mercy. The undeserving poor remind us that something deeper needs to change—whatever it is that makes them feel so helpless and hopeless.

We need to address that something deeper. In the meantime, help them. Do not be overly judgmental or overly careful. If you are going to err, err on the side of compassion."
