**MASS MINUTES**

Lent is the special season for the ascent to the Holy Mountain of Easter. (Daily Roman Missal) Holy Mass is a little different during Lent. In keeping with the emotional tone of repentance and conversion, the alleluia is not prayed or sung. In the first half of Lent, from Ash Wednesday to Saturday of week three, weekday Mass readings from the synoptic gospels emphasize a call to conversion, a new beginning. They attempt to deflate our egos, to recognize our true dependence on God. Beginning on Ash Wednesday, we are reminded that we, “...are dust and to dust [we] shall return,” or to “Repent, and believe in the Gospel.” In Lent, catechumens, preparing for the sacraments of initiation, baptism and confirmation. In the second half of Lent, from Monday of week four, to the Mass of the Lord's Supper, readings are from the Gospel according to John presenting the mystery of Jesus Christ, Son of God, who is a healer and giver of life who will gather the scattered children of God, and all who believe in him will have eternal life.
