"The celebrant raises the Body and Blood of Christ and says, "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world, Blessed are those who are called to the supper of the Lamb." recalling the words spoken by the angel in Revelation, 19:9, "Blessed are those called to the wedding feast of the Lamb." Wedding feast? Yes, communion; Com=with, union=one. We become one with Jesus Christ. Consider that if you eat an orange, the orange becomes you and you become the orange.

The wedding feast of the lamb recalls the Passover meal that has been celebrated in Jewish homes throughout the ages, remembering the lamb that saved the faithful people. The lamb is themselves to each other. Just so, at Communion, we and Jesus give ourselves to each other in a foretaste of the time when we will become one with Christ for all eternity. The clear response to those who protest that they don't have to go to Church to worship God is what is missing at home; true union with the Son of God.

ENCOUNTERING JESUS IN THE EUCHARIST Follow Jesus

Once you know and love someone, you want to be around that person, to spend time with him or her, to find out what pleases that person and what makes that person happy. Brothers and Sisters, this is what following Jesus means. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC):

The works of mercy are charitable actions by which we come to he aid of our neighbor in his spiritual and bodily necessities. nstructing, advising, consoling, comforting, are spiritual works of mercy, as are forgiving and bearing wrong patiently. The corporal works of mercy consist especially in feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless, clothing the naked, visiting the sick and imprisoned, and burying the dead" (no. 2447). This is also the stage of "making disciples." Once you know and love Jesus, you want to share that experience with others. If each Catholic made two disciples over the next few years, by introducing them to Christ and walking with them into full and active participation in the Church, the face of the world would be completely transformed!

Think what it would be like if each of us were making disciples! We would be more available to the plans of God for our lives and in the life of the Church. We would be better prepared to welcome Jesus when he returns for the full establishment of the Kingdom of God. "Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven" (Matthew 6:10)
