When we leave the church building at the end of Mass, it is not Parents/guardians, if you did NOT sign up your son/daughter up like leaving a theater because the movie or play is over; we are sent. Since the fourth century, the Latin Mass has ended with the charge: "ite missa est," meaning "Go, you are dismissed." Think "mission."

According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church (No. 1332). this liturgy is called "Holy Mass" (Missa)", because the liturgy, in which the mystery of salvation is accomplished, concludes with the sending forth (mission) of the faithful so that they may fulfill God's will in their daily lives." In Communion we become one with Christ. If I become one with Christ and you become one with Christ, do we not become one with each other? Therefore, we are sent out in unity and whatever skills or talents we may have are gifts we must share. This changes our attitude and the direction of our lives.
