MASS MINUTES

In response to St. Peter’s speech after the resurrection of Jesus, many were baptized and, “They devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of bread and to the prayers.” (Acts 2:42) These early followers of Christ still considered themselves faithful Jews and attended the synagogue meetings where the scriptures (Old Testament) were read and discussed (like the Liturgy of the Word). They would then go to the home of one of the members to celebrate The Lord’s Supper (Liturgy of the Eucharist). In the second century, Justin Martyr wrote to the Roman emperor, Antoninus Pius, explaining the worship service of the Christians to show that they were nonviolent and not revolutionary. He said that, “...the memoirs of the apostles, [Gospels] are read,” then “...the leader admonishes and challenges them to imitate these beautiful things.” There were then, “Prayers for ourselves and others.” Then “Someone brings bread and water and wine mixed,” and “...all present give voice to an acclamation by saying ‘amen!’” Then, “...those we call deacons give to those present the Eucharisted bread, wine, and water...” Sound familiar?

Encountering Christ in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass

Christ is calling each of us to deepen our prayer lives, and the most intimate way to experience this encounter is in the holy sacrifice of the Mass. This encounter in the Eucharist overflows in love and leads us to turn to him in our daily prayers.

The Eucharist is “...the source and summit of the Christian life. The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Pasch” (CCC, nos. 1324-1327)

The Eucharist is the most intimate way In which Jesus Christ is present to us, because he himself is the sacrament. He is fully present in the Eucharist. Every time we participate in the celebration of the Eucharist, we renew our belief in the truth that Christ gave his very life for each one of us. By receiving Jesus Christ himself, we are able to become more and more like him. This encounter is at the core of who we are as Christians, and our hope is to one day join St. Paul in saying, “It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me.” (Galatians 2:20)
