MASS MINUTES By Deacon Ed Winter

At the end of Mass, we are not told, "You may go home to watch football or go shopping." No, we are sent out to proclaim the Good News. Christ said, "Take up your cross and follow me." What does that mean; what is this "cross"? The burdens of daily life? Bills to pay, children to raise, relationships to be nurtured or repaired? Yes, but more than that. These are exterior things; What about what is in our hearts?

"You have heard that is was said ...[in the Torah] You shall not kill...' But I [Jesus] say to you, whoever is angry with his brother will be liable to judgement..." (Mt 5:22)

Anger, jealousy, lust, deceit, retaliation, hatred; these are the cross we bear. Our failings are a burden that make it more difficult to follow Christ and for Which we will have to account when we come to judgement. ENCOUNTERING JESUS- PASCHAL SACRIFICE

There are four complete accounts of this seder in the New Testament, but none of them mentions a lamb. Only in St. Paul's First letter to the Corinthians do we find a reason for this seeming omission. The apostle explains that Jesus himself is the lamb of the new Passover: "For our paschal lamb, Christ, has been sacrificed" (1 Corinthians 5:7). In the next verse he continues: "Therefore let us celebrate the feast ...with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth." (5:8)

At the beginning of Jesus' ministry, John the Baptist had enigmatically addressed him as "the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world" (John 1:29) thus, as he offered his Body and Blood, Jesus presented himself as the perfect paschal sacrifice. He was God's Lamb. As his life drew to a close, he would apply his own blood to the wood of the cross, evoking the blood of the paschal lamb and its life-saving purpose. The wood of the cross becomes the doorway into freedom from sin and death. To those of us who have attended many Masses, those lines and images are very familiar; the unleavened bread, the chalice of wine, the blessings pronounced over both, the command to "Behold the Lamb of God." When we go to church, the liturgy makes clear that we are seeded at the seder of the New Covenant, the Passover of the new Exodus.
