Deacon's Corner

"As Catholics we use religious items during our devotional times We may have some that are broken or deteriorated and wonder how we should properly dispose of them, such as a broken rosary? Living in today's society when so many things become disposable, we must remember that religious items that have been blessed are for sacred use. How often have I seen religious items in an antique store or consignment shop and either my wife or I have saved it by purchasing the item and bringing it home. The original owner should have donated the item or disposed of it properly. We should all cherish these blessed religious objects, venerate them with piety and if necessary, disposed of them properly.

According to the Code of Canon Law #1171. "Sacred objects which are designated for divine worship by dedication or blessing, are to be treated reverently and are not to be employed for profane or inappropriate use even if they are owned by private person."

If an item such as a rosary is repairable, then yes, repair it if pos sible. If the item is not repairable, then it must be properly disposed of. The Diocese of Superior, Wisconsin provides these suggestions for damaged blessed items:

- 1) Do not throw blessed items away if they are not burnable.
- 2) Disassemble or destroy the blessed object in a manner that prevents profane use. Give them to your parish for burial in a cemetery or on Church grounds.
- 3) "If the item is metal that could be melted down for re-use, it must first be disassembled or destroyed in a way that prevents any profane re-use in its recognizable form prior to its trip to the smelter."

ENCOUNTERING JESUS- Heaven on Earth

Jesus implied all of this in his declaration that the Eucharist is his body and his real presence. If Jesus is truly present, then heaven is there. Wherever the King goes, he is attended by his court. We acknowledge this so many times when we attend the liturgy. In the Penitential |Rite, we recognize that we stand in the presence of "all the angels and saints." As we begin the Eucharistic Prayer, the priest observes: "And so, with angels and archangels, with thrones and dominions, and with all the hosts and powers of heaven, we sing the hymn of your glory. As without end we acclaim...'

This is how the great figures in Church history experienced the Mass. In the fourth century, St Athanasius told his congregation: "My beloved brethren, it is no temporal feast that we come to, but an eternal, heavenly feast. We do not display it is shadows; we approach it in reality"
