
Funeral Note

MASS MINUTES By Deacon Ed Winter

Non-Catholics may express surprise that we move during Mass, but attending Mass is not like attending a play, movie, or concert. At Mass, we are not just audience, we are participants in the celebration, more like a performer in those other activities We are involved physically as well as spiritually, our bodily movement and posture expressing what we are doing.

Standing expresses readiness and a unifying of service as the ministers process in at the beginning of Mass. Think of the cry, "Attention!" when an officer enters a military barracks. Sitting is the posture of listening and learning while scriptures are proclaimed, (not just read), and a homily is preached.

We stand again when we pray in union, "Holy, holy, holy..." and when we pray, "Our Father..." Kneeling for those able to do so, is the most profound sign of reverence during the Consecration and Communion. In medieval times one would kneel before the king. So do we. We sit in silence for a short period of meditation after Communion and then stand to pray together at the end and for the recession of the ministers.
