THE ADVENT WREATH

The Advent Wreath is a cherished tradition for many Catholics, especially during the month of December leading up to Christmas Day. The wreath is typically made of evergreen branches and holds four candles, which are lit one at a time on each of the four Sundays of the Advent season. The circular shape of the wreath symbolizes God's complete and unending love for us, which sent his Son into the world to redeem us from the curse of sin. It also represents eternal life, which becomes ours through faith in Jesus Christ.

Here at St. Joseph's & Saints Peter & Paul we light candles on our Advent Wreath in church each weekend mass of Advent. Each candle holds its own meaning. We will include the meaning of each candle here in the bulletin.




Second Sunday of Advent – Candle of Peace

Mass Minute with Deacon Ed Winter

The "Our Father," or "the Lord's Prayer," is probably the universal Christian prayer. In fact, Jesus said, "This is how you are to pray." (Mt 6:9-13) It is so familiar that it is one of the prayers we have committed to memory and, I'm afraid, we may rush through without even thinking about it. If we do that, we need to slow down and think about each word we say.

St. Therese of Avila was approached one time by a young nun who said, :Please Sister, teach me how to meditate." St. Therese said, "Simply say the Lord's Prayer but take an hour to do it." So, let's start with the first word, "Our." When we pray the Our Father, whether at Mass or in private at home, we begin with, "Our" We are speaking not as an individual but as a member of God's Church.

We use the word "Father" in the same sense that we speak of "the Father of our country" ., meaning the source, the beginner, in fact recognizing God as the source of all being. Then we say, "Hallowed be thy name," honoring the very name of God which is used at times without honor or respect.

"Thy Kingdom, come." What is his kingdom? It is where "Thy will [is] done on earth as it is in heaven." "Give us this day our daily bread." Our first thought may be of the Blessed Sacrament, the Body and Blood of Jesus, but we should think of all our needs including Jesus, our Christ.

Deacon's Corner By Deacon Mark Bortle

After the final blessing, the priest or the deacon, if present, gives the dismissal to the congregation. There are four dismissals that are allowed in the Roman Missal:

- 1. "Go forth, the mass is ended."
- 2. "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord."
- 3. "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life." and
- 4. "Go in peace."

I typically use number three since it requires all of us to be mindful each and every day by glorifying our Lord and Savior in our everyday life. If we truly and honestly keep these words in our thoughts and actions during the week, we can show the world that we, as Catholics, do indeed glorify our Lord though our everyday lives, 24/7/365. And not just by honoring Him through attending mass each weekend.
