**Mass Minutes

After we all pray in the words of the Centurion, "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed," the priest takes the host saying, "May the Body of Christ keep me safe for eternal life" and consumes it. He then takes the chalice and prays, "May the Blood of Christ keep me safe for eternal life," and consumes it.

The priest or deacon purify the vessels with a little water to remove every tiny particle of the Body and Blood of Christ and the water suspension is consumed. During this time the priest will say quietly, "What has passed our lips as food, O Lord, may we possess in purity of heart that what has been given to us in time may be our healing for eternity.

Thus, the public prayers of the liturgy are accompanied by the private prayers of the ministers just as they are accompanied by the private prayers of the faithful. Next: The Lord's Prayer in the bible.

The Shack


Date: Monday, March 2nd at 1:30pm in the Faith Formation Building. With Penny Biwer & Laura Hoffman


