





**Mass Minutes

Continuing the Mass prayers you may not hear, during the Offertory chant the priest will accept gifts from the people, bread and wine, and say, "Blessed are you Lord God of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the bread we offer you; fruit of the earth and work of human hands, it will become for us the bread of life."

The deacon, or the priest celebrant if there is no deacon, will pour the wine into the chalice, add a little water, and say this beautiful prayer, "Through the mystery of this water and wine, may we come to share in the Divinity of Christ who humbled himself to share in our humanity." The priest then takes the chalice, shows it, and says, "Blessed are you God of all creation for through your goodness we have received the wine we offer your, fruit of the vine and work of human hands, it will become our spiritual drink." If an Offertory chant is not sung, these prayers over the bread and wine may be said aloud and the people will respond to each, "Blessed be God forever."

- Chapstick



Deacon's Corner By Deacon Mark Bortle

Why DOES THE PRIEST OR DEACON ADD A DROP OF WATER INTO THE WINE AT MASS?

If you've ever watched closely at the Offertory, you'll notice something small, almost unnoticed, yet deeply symbolic. As the priest or deacon prepares the chalice, he pours wine...and then adds just a few drops of water. Why? Why mix water with wine before consecration? This quiet gesture, ancient and sacred, carries one of the most profound mysteries of our faith. Let's break it down

The Mystery of the Incarnation: Before consecration, the priest or deacon quietly says as he adds water to the chalice: "By the mystery of this water and wine may we come to share in the divinity of Christ, who humbled Himself to share in our humanity."

That's the key. The wine represents Christ's divinity. The drop of water represents our humanity. When the priest or deacon mixes them, it's a sign that God became man, that divinity and humanity were united forever in Jesus Christ. Just as the water disappears into the wine, our human nature is taken up, transformed, and divinized in Christ. It's a small drop, but it tells the greatest story: God stooped down to lift us up.

A Sign of Union, Christ and His Church: From the earliest centuries, the Church Fathers saw another meaning. The wine is Christ. The water is the Church, you and me. When the water mingles with the wine, it symbolizes the inseparable bond between Jesus and His Bride, the Church. Just as that drop can never be separated from the wine, we are called to be one with Christ forever. "Just as the water is mingled with the wine, so may we be united with Christ who took our human nature." It's a symbol of communion, unity, and love, Christ giving Himself completely to His people.

A Symbol of Blood and Water from His Side: When Jesus was pierced on the Cross, the Gospel tells us that blood and water flowed from His side (John 19:34). The early Church saw in that blood and water the birth of the sacraments, the Eucharist (Blood) and Baptism (Water). At every Mass, when the priest adds that drop of water, we are mystically brought back to Calvary, to the very moment when the Church was born from the wounded Heart of the Savior. The wine and water become one, just as Christ and His Church are one.

So What Does This Small act really mean? That tiny drop of water carries a universe of meaning. It reminds us that: God became man so that man might share in God's life. We, the Church, are united forever with Christ our Head. Every Mass is a return to the Cross, where mercy flowed in blood and water. The next time you see the priest add that drop of water into the chalice, remember: it's not just a ritual. It's the mystery of the Incarnation made visible. It's our union with Christ renewed. It's the heart of the Gospel, hidden in a drop. * A little water, * A cup of wine * a union of Heaven and earth. This is the Mass. This is the mystery. This is our faith.
