Recently, we've had an influx of request from "friends" involved in domestic disputes. Whether this results in violence or whether things end amicably, it often results in a homeless situation for one or the other or both of the parties. We try to help with this, but our focus is mostly the nuts and bolts of the financial end of the relationship. That's important immediately, but both parties need a lot more than someone to help them out of their homelessness. They need the support of family, friends and neighbors. They will probably need this support for an extended time. If you know people in this situation please be there for them. We will always try to be their "Friends," but they're your friends too. If you find yourself in this situation, Help of Door County (920-743-8785) is an excellent resource. We partner with them regularly.

**MASS MINUTE
BY DEACON EDWARD WINTER**

It has been said that in attending a Jewish worship service, one can come to a better understanding of the Church's liturgy. Remember that the First Christians considered themselves still to be faithful Jews, attended a synagogue on the Sabbath, and listened to the reading and discussion of the scriptures. Then they went to someone's home to celebrate the Lord's Supper. Justin Martyr, writing about Baptism in the first century, said, "After coming from the place of washing, we are thoroughly anointed with a blessed unction, from the ancient disciple by which in the [Levitical] priesthood they were accustomed to be anointed with a horn of oil ever since Aaron was anointed by Moses."

The second Vatican Council went back to our ancient roots for the liturgy. It said that the works of God among the people in the old testament were but a prelude to the work of Christ in redeeming mankind. God spoke to our fathers in faith through the prophets. "...when the fullness of time had come [mankind was ready] he sent his Son, the Word made flesh, to preach the gospel to the poor, to heal the contrite."

"(Jesus Christ) came to Nazareth where he had grown up and went according to his custom into the synagogue on the Sabbath day." He read from the prophet, Isaiah, and said, "Today this scripture passage has been fulfilled in your hearing." Lk 4:16
