

Mass Minute

Candles have been used by all religions from very ancient times. Light has represented divine presence, joy, happiness, goodness, purity, life, and celebration. It was the Jewish custom to bless special lamps in the evening as part of ceremonial meals, such as the Sabbath meal. Hanukkah (rededication of the temple) is the Feast of Lights.

For early Christians, a light was the reflection of the light of Christ among them. Jesus said, "I am the light of the world. No follower of mine shall ever walk in darkness." (Jn 8:12) At Christmas midnight Mass, we begin by hearing, "The people who walked in darkness, have seen a great light; upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom, light has shown." (Is 9:1)

Candles were used in funeral processions from the 3rd century, were used symbolically for Mass from, at least, the 7th century, and were placed on the altar in the 11th century. But candle light means more than just the presence of Christ. "You are the light of the world." (Mt 5:14) and "...your light must shine before others that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father." (Mt 5:16) Light refers to us, also.
