Mass Minute with Deacon Ed Winter

Early Christians were accused of cannibalism because they said they were eating the body and drinking the blood of a human being. We are no longer accused of cannibalism but there is still a lot of misunderstanding of the sacrifice of the Mass. Let's look at some non-Catholic views of the Mass.

Some consider it a more colorful and elaborate form of the Communion Service that they are used to. Others, however, think of the Mass as being blasphemy because a priest claims to be making a sacrifice; he is not. The ordained priest is standing in the person of Christ. Acting through him, Jesus is the priest and the victim in this sacrifice. His sacrifice is made not again but still; not "again" but "still". Jesus' eternal sacrifice for all of us is made present to us, not by the ordained priest but by Jesus himself.

Others see the sacrifice as separate from the Eucharist and many see the Eucharist as a mere symbol of the Body and Blood of Jesus and a memorial of his passion and death. Lutheran and other denominations of Christians believe Christ is present in the bread and wine, not accepting the doctrine of Transubstantiation. The Church teaches us that the Eucharistic species are the Body and Blood of Christ with the accidents (appearances) of bread and wine.
