## Mass Minute with Deacon Ed Winter

There appears to be some controversy regarding the old, Latin Mass so let's go back to get the facts straight. Damasus 1, Pope from 366 to 384 A.D., decided to translate the prayers of the liturgy from Greek or Hebrew to Latin, the vernacular, the language of the people in the Romane empire. He also commissioned St. Jerome to translate the bible from the original language to Latin, the "Vulgate." Incidentally, he also introduced reception of Communion in the hand. Latin remained the standard language for the Mass until modern times, although various translations were done over the years. When Latin was no longer spoken by the people, it was retained for the Mass so that the liturgy would be the same around the world. When Latin became a dead language, the role of the priest's prayers were by two pre-adolescent boys. (Never girls, of course). Frequently, people would privately pray the rosary during Mass. The celebrant would greet the people and preach in their vernacular but all the rest of the liturgy would be in Latin.
