

Not only will he become St. Carlo, but there will also be another young saint canonized! Pope Leo announced that Acutis would be canonized along with another Italian Catholic Pier Giorgio Frassati, who also died young at age 24 after contracting polio.

Mass Minute with Deacon Ed Winter

Prophets played an important role in unfolding history and truth. The bible prophets, that is, those whose books are part of the bible, wrote and preached from about 740 B.C. to 455 B.C. The most prominent of the Major Prophets is Isaiah, who wrote in the 8th century B.C. to the Kingdom of Judah, the southern kingdom, anticipating the coming of the Messiah.

Jeremiah is sometimes called the "weeping prophet". He ministered before and during the exile in Babylon. His writing warned of God's judgement, the destruction of Jerusalem, and included a promise of a new covenant...

Ezekial was among the Babylonian exiles. He used vivid symbolic actions to reveal God's message of judgement and restoration of Israel.

Daniel, renowned for his apocalyptic vision, wrote largely of history, about the fall of future empires, the coming of "One like a son of Man" and God's eternal Kingdom.

Among the 12 Minor Prophets, Hosea used imagery of his own marriage to illustrate God's covenant faithfulness, Joel prophesied the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, and Jonah was called to preach repentance to Nineveh, showing God's mercy extending beyond Israel. Others spoke of social justice, God's care of the poor, his judgement, hope for the humble, Messianic references, and why God allows evil.

Deacon's Corner By Deacon Mark Bortle

WHY DOES THE PRIEST AND DEACON KISS THE ALTAR AT THE BEGINNING OF MASS?

Before celebrating every Mass the priest and deacon approach the altar and kiss it. To some this practice seems rather odd, as altars are material objects of stone or wood and don't seem to warrant any particular reverence. What is the significance behind this ancient custom?

Jesus is the center, source and goal of our worship and the altar is the center point of the celebration of the Mass, so when the priest and deacon reverence the altar with a kiss, he is showing his love for Christ who is the center of life and worship.

In kissing the altar:

- * The priest symbolizes the bond between Christ and his Church;
- * Acknowledges the sacrifices of those martyrs (relics) who gave their life for the furtherance of the faith;
- * And, when performed with the deacon, is an extension of peace to the community.

CONCLUSION

The next time you see the priest and deacon reverence the altar with a kiss, remember these reasons for the action and thank the Father for the gift of his Son, Jesus, and the many saints that have given their lives to Christ and intercede for us daily, and especially as we gather for the worship of Christ, the Eternal Priest.
