Why Latin Still Matters at Mass

You may notice that some prayers at Mass are sung or spoken in Latin—Sanctus (“Holy, Holy, Holy”), Agnus Dei (“Lamb of God”), or Kyrie eleison (“Lord, have mercy”). These aren’t just old words; they’re part of our unique Catholic identity.

Vatican II guidance: The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy (Sacrosanctum Concilium), reminds us that “the use of the Latin language is to be preserved in the Latin rites” (SC 36). It also encourages the faithful to know and sing parts of the Mass in Latin (SC 54).

Our heritage: As members of the Latin Rite Church, Latin is our “mother tongue” of worship. It links us with Catholics across the world and across centuries.

Why it’s beautiful: Latin gives a sense of universality, connects us to tradition, and adds reverence and mystery to our prayer.

So when we sing Agnus Dei or the Sanctus in Latin, we’re not stepping back in time—we’re stepping into the living stream of our faith, united with the universal Church, across all time. What a gift!

**Mass Minute
with Deacon Ed Winter**

Further mysteries are revealed as we seek understanding of the Mass. Some people have complained that the Mass is all about ritual and tradition, not about God, however, the ritual and tradition are ALL about God.

We begin by asking forgiveness from God for sins against God. We follow with a prayer to God and then read the Word of God, inspired in God's servants by God. Usually, a homily seeks deeper understanding of God's word.

We then offer gifts to God, asking that they become the Body and Blood of the Son of God. The celebrant repeats the words of Jesus on the night before he died and we are nourished spiritually and physically by the Body and Blood of the Son of God. Finally, we are sent back out into the world to announce the gospel of the Lord to all. So, what part or even what word of the Mass is not about God?
