After the Sign of the Cross, Confiteor, Lord have mercy, and the Gloria, we sit down to hear sacred scripture, the inspired, not dictated, word of God proclaimed.
“To compose the sacred books, God chose certain men who, all the while he employed them in this task, made full use of all their faculties and powers so that, though he acted in them and by them, it was as true authors that they consigned to writing whatever he wanted written and no more.” (Second Vatican Council ;Dei Verbum) The Sunday scriptures are read in a three year cycle from Old Testament, Psalms, New Testament, and Gospel. The reading are chosen for the Church seasons and in between seasons, Ordinary Time as now, focus on the lessons from Jesus public ministry.

DEACON'S CORNER

How does one become a permanent deacon? Men must be a confirmed member of the Roman Catholic Church, permanent residents of the Green Bay diocese, and be between the ages of 30 and 55. they must be recommended by their pastor; have a history of parish involvement, service to others, and leadership capabilities; be in good physical and emotional health; and have a stable work history. A married applicant must have a stable and happy marriage and his wife and children must support his interest in the diaconate. Single applicants must be willing to commit to celibacy after ordination. Applicants must have at least a high school diploma or its equivalent and be able to take college level courses.

The Lord places confidence in those who have received good things and expects much from them.

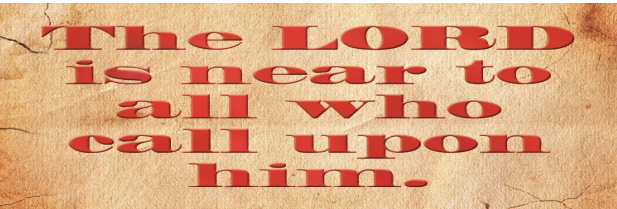


TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME
