**MASS MINUTES**  
**By Deacon Ed**  
Having looked at the Liturgy of the Word, now might be a good time to consider what liturgy means and how it involves us. The work Liturgy comes from the Greek meaning “Work of the people.” Note that it is not “the work of the clergy.” It is, also, the work of Jesus Christ, the work of salvation we cannot do. It is also the work of God in which the people participate. Liturgy is a means of worship, which is “rendering to God what is owed God by intelligent beings.” (Fr. Vincent Michel, OSB) Attending Mass is not like going to a movie, where we sit waiting to be entertained. “It is the duty of the pastor to ensure that the faithful take part, fully aware of what they are doing, actively engaged in the rite, and enriched by its effects.” (Fr. Eusebius Martis, OSB) Vatican II called us, the people, to full, active, and conscious participation in the liturgy. The pastor can only provide fullness of the liturgy, the time, and the place. He cannot control our consciousness or activity.
