MASS MINUTES By Deacon Ed

A few thoughts about the homily; there is no question that some homilies are good and inspiring and some are less so. Fr. Louis J. Cameli of the Archdiocese of Chicago recently addressed this problem. He pointed out that God gave us his words in scripture to help us and, although the homilist worked very hard to break open God's word for us, we have to good listeners to benefit from it. Fr. Cameli suggests that we should read the scripture readings before Mass, perhaps the day before. Access to the readings is easy at —www.bible.uscc[1]b.org— and they are listed in our weekly bulletin. Fr. Cameli says to read as if God is trying to communicate with you personally. "Don't try to figure things out. Rather, listen attentively, as you would to someone who loves you and wants to communicate with you because that is exactly what God is doing through the biblical word."

You need to be an active listener to benefit from the homily, regardless of the skills of the homilist.

DEACON'S CORNER

"Many of you may be wondering what is the role and function of a Permanent Deacon. A deacon is an ordained man who has received special formation and training to serve the Church. His threefold ministry includes: service of the word where the Deacon proclaims the Gospel and occasionally gives a homily at weekend mass; service of liturgy where the Deacon assists the priest at mass, is an ordinary minister of Holy Communion, and can also preside at Baptisms, Marriages, and Funerals outside of mass; and service of charity where the Deacon may bring communion to the sick or homebound, assist with various other ministries of the church such as being a Life teen core member, and other ministry duties as needed, such as leading Stations of the Cross during Lent."
