**MASS MINUTES**

When we expect special guests to come for dinner at our home, we carefully clean our house and then we prepare the table. We get out our best silverware, dishes, glasses, and serving pieces. Maybe we even have cloth, rather than paper, napkins. So, when we are expecting a special guest, Our Lord and Savior, at Mass, we carefully prepare the table. We call it a table because we are preparing a meal. We also call it an altar because we are preparing a sacrifice. We bring some special cloths, called Corporals, linen cloths on which the Eucharistic elements will be placed, a chalice (or two since the pandemic) for the wine, a paten, a small plate for the bread (host), and one or more smaller cloths called Purificators, like napkins. Setting the table is a ritual, just as when we set our table at home, hoping to make it attractive and comfortable. Now we are ready to receive the gifts. Next: the Gifts

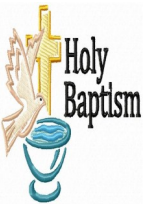
