



Namibia Adventure Program

Day 1: Arrival in Windhoek – Dive into Namibia

Welcome to Windhoek, Namibia's vibrant capital! As you touch down at Windhoek International Airport, our warm and friendly guide will be there to greet you. Get ready to kickstart your Namibian adventure by picking up your fully-equipped 4WD rental cars. Drive to Windhoek, where you'll spend your first night in this captivating country.

Dinner and overnight: Windhoek

Day 2 & 3: Windhoek – Sossusvlei

Your adventure begins today! Hop into your vehicles and begin driving through Namibia's breathtaking landscapes to the famous **Sossusvlei** in the **Namib-Naukluft Park**.

Sossusvlei is a clay pan formed by infrequent flooding from the **Tsauchab River**, creating some of the world's highest red sand dunes. The surrounding desert features **Camelthorn trees** and four notable pans: Sossusvlei, Dead Vlei, Hidden Vlei, and Nara Vlei.

A visit to the nearby **Sesriem Canyon** is recommended. This picturesque canyon, about 30 meters deep and 18 million years old, was named by settlers who had to tie six oryx-hide belts together to reach the water pools below. These pools attract several species of birds and animals.

Dinner and overnight in Sossusvlei area.





Day 4: Sossusvlei – Walvis Bay

Today, travel via **Solitaire**, a quirky desert stop with a filling station, a chapel, and a bakery famous for its apple pie—reputed to be the best in Namibia.

After refueling your vehicle, continue to **Walvis Bay** via the **scenic Gaub - and Kuiseb Pass** to the west-coast, where stops are recommended at the various viewpoints to take photos and to enjoy the amazing scenery. The closer you get to the Atlantic coast, the less it rains, and you will notice that the climate differs significantly from other

Day 5: Walvis Bay – Swakopmund

This morning, join a **catamaran and dolphin cruise**. The tour is led by experienced guides and well-qualified and experienced skippers. Watch playful seals jump on board and keep an eye out for dolphins swimming alongside. Sparkling wine, fresh oysters, and snacks are served on board before returning to shore around 12:30.

In the afternoon, drive along the coastal road from Walvis Bay to **Swakopmund**, with dunes on one side and ocean on the other. Explore Swakopmund's historic buildings such as the **Lighthouse, Otavi Bahnhof**, and the **Jetty**, over 100 years old. A visit is recommended to the **National Marine Aquarium** and **Swakopmund Museum**, offering insights into Namibia's natural and cultural history.

Dinner and overnight in Swakopmund area.

Day 6: Swakopmund – Twyfelfontein

After breakfast, embark on a longer drive along the **Skeleton Coast**, passing the fishing town of **Henties Bay** and continuing east through the **Tsiseb Conservancy** and **Uis** to reach the **Twyfelfontein** area. Optional visits include the **rock engravings**, the **Organ Pipes**, and **Burnt Mountain**, all rich in geological and cultural significance.

Dinner and overnight in Twyfelfontein area.





Day 7: Twyfelfontein – Palmwag

After a leisurely morning departure toward **Palmwag**, a tranquil oasis on the **Uniab River** in northwest **Damaraland**. This area is home to **desert-adapted wildlife** including desert elephants, black rhinos, giraffes, zebras, gemsbok and many other wild animal species and sunsets to dream of. It also hosts **Namibia's largest predator population** outside of Etosha, with over 100 lions, cheetah, leopard, brown and spotted hyena.

Bird life is prolific and diverse with most of Namibia's endemics present. This concession supports a healthy population of desert adapted black rhino and elephants.

Dinner and overnight Palmwag area.

Day 8: Palmwag – Kaokoland

After breakfast, drive via **Sesfontein** to **Opuwo**, gateway to the remote **Kaokoland** region.

This remote region is home to the **Himba people**, This remote area, south of the Kunene river, is home to the Himba; people who have kept their ethnic individuality and culture, whilst surviving in the seclusion of Kaokoland.

Dinner and overnight: Kaokoland area.

Day 9: Epupa Falls

Following breakfast, our route takes us north to the captivating **Epupa Falls**, a region brimming with stunning sunsets, the thundering Epupa Falls, diverse birdlife, the majestic Baobab trees, and encounters with the **Himba tribes**.

Enjoy a guided Himba visits that offer meaningful insight into one of Namibia's most iconic communities.

Dinner and overnight: Omarunga Camp or similar





Day 10: Uukwaluudhi Wildlife and Scenic Views – A Day of Discovery

After breakfast, we'll drive back to Opuwo before heading east on the main road C35. Along the way, you'll encounter a 6000-hectare game farm, offering opportunities to spot antelopes, giraffes, zebras, and more. Enjoy a picturesque main area with an open veranda-style design, providing sweeping views of the vast savannah plains.

Dinner and overnight: in a lodge in Uukwaluudhi area.

Day 11: Etosha National Park

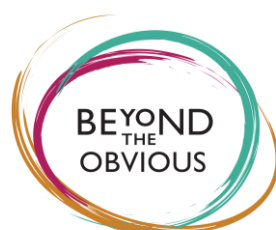
After breakfast, we'll travel through Ovamboland on the main road C41 and enter Etosha National Park via King Nehale Gate. Etosha, an immense saline desert, is a haven for wildlife, boasting an incredible variety of species, including the "BIG 5." Be prepared for wildlife encounters as you traverse the park on your way to Namutoni, ensuring you arrive before sunset.

Dinner and overnight: Etosha park area

Day 12: Etosha National Park

Embark on another thrilling day at Etosha Reserve, exploring various waterholes and witnessing the astounding diversity of animals. We'll go above and beyond to give you the best chance to spot the "BIG 5." Lunch and relaxation await at Halali, followed by more reserve exploration in the afternoon. After dinner, embark on a fascinating night hike to a waterhole, where you'll witness nocturnal animals quenching their thirst under the moonlight.

Dinner and overnight: Etosha park area





Day 13: Etosha – Windhoek

Depart Etosha and drive via **Outjo**, **Otjiwarongo**, and **Okahandja**, where you can stop at the **woodcraft market** for authentic souvenirs. In Windhoek, return your rental car and check into your hotel.

Enjoy a festive farewell dinner in a local restaurant.

Overnight: Windhoek Country Club Resort – Bed & Breakfast or similar

Day 14: Departure

Morning transfer to the airport according to your flight schedule.

Meal: Breakfast only
