

He said to them, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest. Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves. Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along the way. Into whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this household.' If a peaceful person lives there, your peace will rest on him; but if not, it will return to you. Stay in the same house and eat and drink what is offered to you, for the laborer deserves his payment. Do not move about from one house to another. Whatever town you enter and they welcome you, eat what is set before you, cure the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God is at hand for you.""

Gospel of Luke

One witty person has said that 'culture' is how the world gets on when we're all asleep; how life takes over without our helping hand. Habits are the building blocks of culture. Habits: the things we do automatically, by custom, without having to think. Habits can be handy. They spare us from making big deals out of small decisions. Habits: brushing teeth morning and night, looking left and right before crossing a street, pausing for prayer when the Angelus sounds.

When habits are commonplace and shared they form what we call a culture, be it of a family, a school, a workplace, a club, a parish or an entire nation. It can be hard to go against a shared mindset or pattern of behavior. It can hurt to run counter to the prevailing current.

Today we are walking with a sizable band of disciples, in step with Jesus, towards Jerusalem. He is heading there, not as a visitor but as a prophet. Everything he says and does challenges the worldview of the city's religious leaders. His teachings and actions are contrary to their way of thinking. He is counter-cultural. And he is open-eyed about the consequences.

Jesus' instruction to his apprentice missionaries are at odds with what is usual. They are to enter all homes – left, right and center – with the godly gift of 'Peace to all' and not just to members of their specially favored nation. Within respectable Jewish culture, this is a major 'no-no.' They are to 'salute no one on the road.' Another serious no -no for it goes against their norms of hospitality which require of the saluting party to spend a whole day as a guest of the saluted one. But Jesus does not wish any custom to deflect his trainees from their prime purpose. Once again, he goes countercultural for the sake of a higher goal. This is a formula that can land him – and us – with a crown of thorns.

Seeing Your Life Through the Lens of the Gospel

1) Jesus sent out his disciples on a mission to let people know 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.' Recall when you have reached out to another in word or in deed to help them realize that they were cherished, perhaps by a word of sympathy or encouragement, or by giving a hand with a difficult task. What was it like for you to experience your self as a person bringing help and encouragement to another?

2) Recent events (Covid pandemic, the war in Ukraine, and poverty and famine in some countries) have created situations of dire need for some. These crises have also brought out great generosity as people reached out in caring for the sick and refugees and contributing money when they could. Perhaps there are individuals or groups that have particularly inspired your. Remember them and ask God's blessing on them.

3) Jesus sent the disciples out two by two. When have you found it beneficial not to be working alone, but with another by your side? How did companionship change the experience? What were you able to achieve together that you could not have done on your own?

4) When the disciples returned Jesus warned them not to focus on the thrill of what they had been able to achieve. It was more important that their 'names are written in heaven.' Sometimes we also need reminders that who we are is more important than what we do. Who have been the people who brought this home to you? Have there been experiences that helped you to appreciate this?






