A Reading from The Gospel according to Luke Luke 14:1, 7-14

On a sabbath Jesus went to dine at the home of one of the leading Pharisees, and the people there were observing him carefully.

He told a parable to those who had been invited, noticing how they were choosing the places of honor at the table. "When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not recline at table in the place of honor. A more distinguished guest than you may have been invited by him, and the host who invited both of you may approach you and say, 'Give your place to this man,' and then you would proceed with embarrassment to take the lowest place. Rather, when you are invited, go and take the lowest place so that when the host comes to you he may say, 'My friend, move up to a higher position.' Then you will enjoy the esteem of your companions at the table. For every one who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." Then he said to the host who invited him, "When you hold a lunch or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or your wealthy neighbors, in case they may invite you back and you have repayment. Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

Gospel of Luke

True humility is recognizing and accepting the wonder of our being, and of our giftedness. As the famous spiritual writer, C.S. Lewis stated: 'Humility is not thinking less of yourself but thinking of yourself less.'

What then are we to make of Jesus' challenge to the Pharisees about their behavior when invited to a feast? He had noticed how they chose 'the places of honor' (Lk 14:7). We could be forgiven for thinking that the reason for this behavior was their high opinion of themselves, but this is not the case. They chose the seats of honor because they wanted others to think highly of them, which is not the same thing. The desire to appear important in the eyes of others betrays an insecurity that comes from not really appreciating oneself. Those who have a genuine appreciation of their own worth do not need to put themselves ahead of others. Freed from that destructive desire, they can allow others to let their lights shine. They have no problem taking a back seat when invited to a feast.

What Jesus is challenging is the Pharisees' selfishness and small- mindedness. They are 'full of themselves' and want to appear important because they do not have a true sense of their own worth as creatures of a loving God. Therefore, they look for, and need, the approval of others. We can sometimes behave like that too. We can feel so insecure about our own giftedness that we are always seeking the approval of others. Jesus calls the Pharisees (and us) to a higher standard of behavior, the kind of behavior that only truly free persons with a healthy self-image can practice: When you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind. That they cannot repay you means that you are fortunate because repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again' (Lk 14:13-14). This is the kind of behavior that truly humble people practice –behavior based on seeing the needs of others and tending to them. Let us, then, take up the challenge of Jesus and live our lives in humble service of others, especially those who cannot repay our love.

Seeing Your Life Through the Lens of the Gospel

What is 'humility'?

Some think being humble means we can't acknowledge the good we do. They might go so far as to think being humble means thinking they are not good. That's not true. We can be humble and acknowledge the good we do by giving credit where credit is done.

This begins with acknowledging that the Lord is 'the giver of every good gift' (opening prayer for Mass today). We are able to do good because of the gifts God has given us. Jesus teaches about humility in the context of places of honor at a wedding banquet. Humility is a virtue that we need to make part of our whole life. Isn't it easier to work with someone who humbles themselves and will work *with* you rather than work with someone who will do anything to get ahead without concern for others?

In proper humility we open ourselves to the help of others. We open ourselves to God's guidance. Here I think of Sirach's words, 'the mind of a sage appreciates proverbs and an attentive ear is the joy of the wise.' If we are truly humble and wise, we want to listen so that we may grow.

After all, what is our goal? Are we looking to make a lot of money (that would be greed)? Do we just want to look good (that would be pride)? Or are we trying to live the words of the Lord's Prayer, 'your kingdom come,' working to make God's kingdom known in this world?

Triune God, help us to hear the cry of those in poverty, and the cry of the earth, so that we may together care for our common home. Amen




How can older adults in the church do a better job at teaching the youth about our faith?



<u>Saint Teresa of Calcutta</u> Feast Day — September 5th



Raised in a deeply Catholic family in Albania, Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu joined the Sisters of Loreto in 1928 and took the name Teresa. The community sent her to Kolkata, India, where she taught children for two decades. In 1946 Teresa heard God's call to quench the thirst of Jesus by caring for the poorest of the poor. She left the Sisters of Loreto to rescue the sick and destitute in the slums of Kolkata — one at a time. Many volunteers soon joined her and she formed them into her religious order, the

Missionaries of Charity. Teresa's manifest goodness and her unique media savvy attracted global attention, drawing many people to God.

Many regard her as the greatest Catholic evangelist of the 20th century. She was beatified in 2003 and canonized in 2016.
