


GOSPEL

A Reading from The Gospel according to Luke <u>Luke 16:1-13</u>

Jesus said to his disciples, "A rich man had a steward who was reported to him for squandering his property. He summoned him and said, 'What is this I hear about you? Prepare a full account of your stewardship, because you can no longer be my steward.' The steward said to himself, 'What shall I do, now that my master is taking the position of steward away from me? I am not strong enough to dig and I am ashamed to beg. I know what I shall do so that, when I am removed from the stewardship, they may welcome me into their homes.' He called in his master's debtors one by one. To the first he said, 'How much do you owe my master?' He replied, 'One hundred measures of olive oil.' He said to him, 'Here is your promissory note. Sit down and quickly write one for fifty.' Then to another the steward said, 'And you, how much do you owe?' He replied, 'One hundred kors of wheat.' The steward said to him, 'Here is your promissory note; write one for eighty.' And the master commended that dishonest steward for acting prudently.

"For the children of this world are more prudent in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. I tell you, make friends for yourselves with dishonest wealth, so that when it fails, you will be welcomed into eternal dwellings. The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones; and the person who is dishonest in very small matters is also dishonest in great ones. If, therefore, you are not trustworthy with dishonest wealth, who will trust you with true wealth? If you are not trustworthy with what belongs to another, who will give you what is yours? No servant can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and mammon."

Gospel of Luke

Today's gospel calls us to account for our management of all that we are and all that we have. The demand for an accounting often sounds like someone is in trouble. That's how today's parable begins. The manager has been charged with squandering his master's property. He is going to be fired. He will lose his job, income, reputation, and status. At some level he will lose his life as he now knows it.

Whether we've lived it, heard it from a friend or colleague, or read it in the news, it's a familiar story. Somebody has been bad. They've been caught. Now they're going to get what they deserve. That's how the world works. That's what we expect. But that's not how the kingdom of God works and parables rarely give us what we expect. So we ought not be too quick to come to a final or definitive interpretation of this parable. We cannot with ease or confidence declare who, if any one in particular, each character represents: God, Jesus, or us. The parable offers ambiguity and tension not a neat resolution and that feels a lot like real life.

What if the accounting is not about finding wrongdoing but new life? What if its about grace rather than punishment? If a parable makes sense we've probably missed the point.

The accounting of our management isn't about numbers, wrongdoing, or punishment but about helping us see and orient our lives in a new direction. It opens us to new possibilities. It points us to our eternal home.

'Give me an accounting of your management. What are you doing with your life? Who are you serving?

Seeing Your Life Through the Lens of the Gospel

Encountering Christ:

- 1) God Calls Me to Be a Steward: The Gospel uses the image of a steward to describe our place in this world. A steward is entrusted to care for the master's property until his return. Time on earth is limited, and we will eventually need to give an account of our stewardship. In the end, everything has been entrusted to our protection, and all of us are responsible for it. Be protectors of God's gifts!' (Pope Francis, March 19, 2013). What precious goods has the Creator placed in our care?
- 2) Be a Smart Investor: We need to be wise and prudent with worldly investments to provide for ourselves and those under our care. This Gospel challenges us to apply similar strategies to our spiritual lives. We have been given spiritual gifts by the Holy Spirit for our growth and the good of the Kingdom of Christ. No one has the same gifts because all of us have been given unique and irreplaceable missions by God. May we properly evaluate our investment priorities so that we won't gain the whole world but end up losing our soul. (Matthew 16:26)
- 3) A Training Ground: Today's parable invites us to train ourselves in the art of spiritual investment once we have set our priorities. The Church has left us with troves of spiritual treasures; we can learn from the lives of the saints, their spiritual writings, and commentaries on the Scriptures. We have recourse to the sacraments, different forms of prayer, retreats, and spiritual guidance. The resources are there. How is the Lord inviting us to deepen our relationship with him?



World Mission Weekend A Visit From Rev. Leonard Kayondo October 4th & 5th, 2025

During this year's World Mission Sunday, to be celebrated on October 19 as the climax of World Mission Month, we are inviting Catholics across the United States to reflect on the work of the Church in Vietnam, where the faith, tested by persecution and poverty, shines with extraordinary vitality and joy. There, priests, religious sisters, and lay volunteers serve those suffering in body and spirit, not



only with medicine and care, but with the Gospel of hope. These are the kinds of communities supported by the World Mission Sunday collection in places where the Church is young, where vocations are growing, and where, like our Holy Father Pope Leo XIV did in his years as bishop of Chiclayo, Peru, missionaries are bringing Christ and his saving Gospel to the peripheries.

The theme of World Mission Sunday this year — *Missionaries of Hope Among the Peoples* — was chosen by Pope Francis before his death and is obviously tied to the Jubilee of Hope. That hope is the lived reality of priests, sisters, and lay faithful who are bringing the light of Christ into places darkened by suffering, war, poverty, and other existential difficulties.

Nearly killed in Rwandan genocide, Fall River priest honored for his efforts to promote peace Greg Sullivan@heraldnews.com

The Rev. Leonard Kayondo came face to face with his would-be murderers at his front door. A Roman Catholic priest ministering in Rwanda in 1994, Kayondo had just finished conducting morning Mass at church and was enjoying a cup of tea in the rectory when the knock came When Kayondo opened the door, he saw three men. One, carrying a gun, was military dressed; the other two Kayondo recognized as local officials. He knew the situation. He had made the hit list. The infamous Rwandan genocide of spring-summer 1994 had already begun. Clergy were not exempt from the ethnic extremists' Hutus' killing of ethnic Tutsis.

Unaware of what Leonard looked like, the men asked for the priest's whereabouts. "I said, 'Let me find out," said Kayondo, the chaplain at Saint Anne's Hospital in Fall River. "That was not me who said that. I was dreaming. I managed to say the right words." Leonard left the men at the front door, went out the back door. The three men went away, but Kayondo, went into hiding/exile for six months, until the genocide which took an estimated 800,000 lives ended. Churches, including Kayondo's, were looted, burned to the ground. While Leonard left his country - he exiled in nearby Burundi, Kenya and Uganda - he never abandoned it. When he did return, Kayondo's ministry involved tending to families who had lost loved ones, helping young children who had no families. Even burying the victims who often lay where they had dropped, or on the side of the road.

The genocide ended almost 30 years ago; since then, Leonard has made it part of his mission in life to help his beloved Rwanda spiritually, emotionally, physically. The self-described missionary priest from Rwanda has a gift of sharing his story and knowledge in a way that has prompted many in the United States to help the people of Rwanda. Father Kayondo, a resident of the Good Shepherd Parish in Fall River, received an Africa Peace Award from the Center for African Peace and Conflict Resolution. The peace center's biography of Kayondo says he has been devoted to bringing the divided ethnic groups of Rwanda together.

Saint Matthew, Apostle

One of the Twelve Apostles, this tax collector is called Matthew in one Gospel (Mt 9:9) and Levi in two others (Mk 2:14 and Lk 5:27). Scripture scholars believe they are the same man because the call and shared meal with Jesus are similar in all three accounts. He sometimes is credited with writing the Gospel of Matthew, but most scholars think this unlikely. And there is no evidence for early church traditions that Matthew evangelized in Judea, Parthia or Ethiopia, or that he was martyred in Persia.

As Jesus passed by, he saw a man named Matthew sitting at the customs post. He said to him, "Follow me." And he got up and followed him. While he was at table in his house, many tax collectors and sinners came and sat with Jesus and his disciples. The Pharisees saw this and said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" He heard this and said, "Those who are well do not need a physician, but the sick do. Go and learn the meaning of the words, I desire mercy, not sacrifice. I did not come to call the righteous but sinners."


Saint Pio of Pietrelcina "Padre Pio"

Francesco Forgione was born in the Italian farming village of Pietrelcina on May 25, 1887. He was one of seven children. By age five, Francesco had already dedicated his life to God. He helped take care of his family's flock of sheep until age ten. Then, as a requirement for joining the Capuchin order, he received private tutoring, to make up for the time he had spent shepherding, rather than in school. At age fifteen, he joined the Order of Friars Minor, taking the name "Pio."

As a Capuchin Franciscan friar, he experienced both physical illness and spiritual battles, but persevering, he was ordained a priest in 1910. Due to poor health, he stayed mostly with his family until 1916, when he was required to return to the friary.

During World War I, he was drafted to serve in the Italian army in the medical corps in 1914/5, and again in 1917. Both times, illness prevented him from continuing in the service; the second time, he was given a permanent discharge. When he left the service, he returned to the friary of San Giovanni Rotondo, where he remained for the duration of his life.

Friar Pio became known to many as Padre Pio. He bore the stigmata, or wounds of Christ, invisibly from the time of his ordination in 1910 and visibly from 1918. The Vatican investigated the authenticity of his stigmata, and his ministry of prayer and healing, beginning in 1921. As his renown grew, so did persecution. In 1922, various restrictions were placed on his ministry, including being forbidden from giving blessings to the faithful. In 1931, he was forbidden from publicly celebrating Mass, hearing confessions, and receiving visitors. This ban was lifted by the Pope Pius XI in 1933, and Padre Pio was allowed to gradually resume public ministry.

Padre Pio is known for being a gifted confessor, his efficacious intercessory prayer, and other mystical gifts associated with his religious life. Under the direction of Padre Pio, in 1947, construction began to build a hospital to treat patients at San Giovanni Rotondo, using science along with faith and prayer. Shortly before his death in 1968, the stigmata disappeared. He was canonized in 2002 by St. John Paul II. Pope Francis has called Padre Pio an "apostle of the confessional."
