

Gospel of Luke

A certain man asked his 14-year old son to wash his car. It was his first time to ask the son to do this. The man normally got the car washed at the local garage but hadn't the time to go there that day. The son's reaction as to ask the father: "How much will you give me for doing it?" The father was very upset and sad. He replied: "Ever since your birth I took care of you, loved you, fed you, clothed you, sent you to a good school. I never once asked you to pay for this. Loving you as I do how could I have asked you to pay me?"

In the Gospel today Jesus is telling us that we cannot claim anything from God because of any good we do. We can never put God into our debt. We can never make claims on him when we have done our best. Have we not only done our duty? How could we fail to do what God asks if us in response to all God's blessings to us? The whole idea of merit, reward must be abandoned in our approach to God. It is a warning against a bookkeeping mentality. As Jesus says in the gospel: "So with you when you have done all that you have been told to do, say: we are merely servants. We have done no more than our duty."

However, God would not want us to respond only out of a sense of duty but as an act of love. Perhaps instead of saying "I have the faith" it is more appropriate to say "I become a person of faith." In this sense faith is an encounter with Someone we believe loves us and who invites us into a loving relationship, in order to become a partner of his in his work. It begins at baptism but since faith is life it had to grow toward maturity, to develop. The more I experience God's great love for me, the more I will respond. Jesus was always faithful to the will of his Father which finally led to his death on the cross, the true meaning and outcome of faith – giving oneself totally to the other in a relationship no matter the cost.

Seeing Your Life Through the Lens of the Gospel

- 1) Faith can move mountains ...well it can certainly get us moving. Recall a time when you were full of self-doubt, skepticism about a project, or lacking trust in God. What was that like? Contrast this with times when you believed in yourself, or in the value of a project you ad undertaken, or when your faith and trust in God was strong. What kind of faith have you found enriched your life?
- 2) Faith is like a mustard seed, small, and sometimes we may be tempted to wait till our faith grows. Part of the message in the gospel is to use the faith we have, even though it may be small. That is how we grow in believe in ourselves and in God's presence in our lives. Does your experience back up this?
- 3) It is nice when what we do is recognized and acknowledged, but the desire for recognition leaves us vulnerable. It is not always forthcoming. It can be helpful if our main motivation in doing something is the value of action itself. Have you experience this?
- 4) This is particularly true when it comes to love. Live is a free gift. What is given lovingly is not given because of a claim. What if your experience of the freedom of love given and received?





Who can be a part of the O.C.I.A.?


- ·Someone who is unbaptized.

Saint Maria Soledad Torres Acosta

1826 — 1887 FEAST DAY — OCTOBER 11

s a child in Madrid, Spain, Manuela Torres Acosta reportedly was more intent on getting playmates to pray than to play. In 1851, she and six companions were invited by a Servite priest to provide home care to the sick of his parish. Taking the name Maria Soledad to honor Our Lady of Sorrows and overcoming her fear of nursing, she became a founder of the Handmaids of Mary Serving the Sick. As superior for 35 years, she oversaw the congregation's rapid expansion and battled government opposition; she was canonized in 1970. One of her novices said, "Mother Soledad is like an anvil; she is constantly taking a beating."

Saint Faustina Kowalska

1905 — 1938 FEAST DAY — OCTOBER 5

aint Faustina was born in 1905 into a poor Polish family and experienced a religious calling from a young age. She initially deferred pursuing a religious vocation to help her family with her earnings as a housekeeper. At age 19, after a vision of the suffering Jesus, she earnestly sought entrance into religious life. Initially turned away by many convents, she entered the order of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in 1925. In April 1928, she took her first vows with her parents in attendance. St. Faustina served the Congregation as a cook, gardener, and porter. While living a simple religious life, she grew in great union with God, experiencing profound sufferings as well as consolations. She had many visions of Jesus and wrote a diary of her experiences. St. Faustina died from tuberculosis at the age of 33 in 1938.

In 1959, the Vatican suppressed the Divine Mercy devotion. But in 1978, the Sacred Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith lifted the suppression after new original documents were examined and texts were retranslated. Then Cardinal Karol Wojtyla strongly promoted the message of Divine Mercy. Later, as Pope John Paul II, he canonized St.

Faustina, in April 2000, and designated the Second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday. Because of her work fostering devotion to Divine Mercy, St. Faustina is known as the "apostle of Divine Mercy."

Jesus appeared to her many times and spoke of his great and unfathomable mercy to those who would trust in him. Jesus told St. Faustina that he wanted the Sunday after Easter to be celebrated as a "Feast of Mercy," as a refuge for all souls, especially poor sinners. On Divine Mercy Sunday, celebrated the weekend after Easter, the Gospel tells the story of when Jesus appeared in a locked room where the disciples were hiding.


