

A Reading from The Second Letter of Saint Paul to the Thessalonians

2 Thessalonians 3:7-12

Brothers and sisters:

You know how one must imitate us. For we did not act in a disorderly way among you, nor did we eat food received free from anyone. On the contrary, in toil and drudgery, night and day we worked, so as not to burden any of you. Not that we do not have the right. Rather, we wanted to present ourselves as a model for you, so that you might imitate us. In fact, when we were with you, we instructed you that if anyone was unwilling to work, neither should that one eat. We hear that some are conducting themselves among you in a disorderly way, by not keeping busy but minding the business of others. Such people we instruct and urge in the Lord Jesus Christ to work quietly and to eat their own food.

A Reading from The Gospel according to Luke

Luke 21:5-19

While some people were speaking about how the temple was adorned with costly stones and votive offerings, Jesus said, "All that you see here-- the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down."

Then they asked him, "Teacher, when will this happen? And what sign will there be when all these things are about to happen?" He answered, "See that you not be deceived, for many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he,' and 'The time has come.' Do not follow them! When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for such things must happen first, but it will not immediately be the end." Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues from place to place; and awesome sights and mighty signs will come from the sky.

"Before all this happens, however, they will seize and persecute you, they will hand you over to the synagogues and to prisons, and they will have you led before kings and governors because of my name. It will lead to your giving testimony. Remember, you are not to prepare your defense beforehand, for I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking that all your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute. You will even be handed over by parents, brothers, relatives, and friends, and they will put some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed.

By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

Gospel of Luke

Today's readings, as we mark the beginning of the Week of Witness dedicated to praying for Christians persecuted for their faith, speak of trials and endurance. As we reflect on the readings, we focus on Christians persecuted for their faith, trusting in God's promise of ultimate victory.

Malachi prophesies a day when the proud are burned like stubble, but the righteous shine under the 'sun of justice'. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus foretells the temple's destruction and warns of persecutions, urging disciples to persevere: 'By your perseverance, you will secure your lives' (Lk 21:19). Paul, in II Thessalonians, encourages steadfastness in work and faith, avoiding idleness. These readings remind us that persecution tests faith, yet God's justice prevails. For Christians facing hostility today – in places like the Middle East or Africa – Jesus' words offer hope: God is with them, giving strength to endure.

Persecution is not a distant reality; millions of Christians today face violence, discrimination, or imprisonment for their faith. Jesus' warning in the Gospel about betrayal and hatred resonates in regions where believers risk their lives to worship. Yet, He promises wisdom to speak truth under trial. The martyrs and persecuted Christians embody Malachi's 'sun of justice,' shining as witnesses to Christ's love. Their courage challenges us to examine our own faith. Do we stand firm in smaller trials – ridicule, cultural pressures, or moral compromises?

Supporting our persecuted brothers and sisters through prayer, advocacy, and charity strengthens the Body of Christ. One way to do this is by supporting the work of the papal charity Aid to the Church in Need.

Paul's call to work diligently reminds us to live our faith actively, even in adversity. As we face an uncertain world, let's trust God's promise, drawing strength from the Eucharist to persevere, knowing that our endurance leads to eternal life.

As we honor persecuted Christians, let's pray for their strength and witness. May we, too, persevere in faith, trusting in God's justice. Through this Mass, may Christ fortify us to live boldly for him, united with all who suffer for his name.

Seeing Your Life Through the Lens of the Gospel

1) On the Temporary Nature of Things

Jesus points to the magnificent temple, stating it will be utterly destroyed. This is a stark reminder that even the most stable and beautiful human institutions are temporary. My security cannot be founded on anything of this world, but only on the eternal, unchanging character of God.

2) On Not Being Terrified

Jesus predicts wars and disasters but commands, 'Do not be frightened.' His words are not a promise of escape from hardship, but of His presence within it. This gives me a supernatural peace, knowing He is sovereign over global chaos and my personal struggles alike.

3) On the Purpose of Persecution

Jesus says persecution will be an opportunity for testimony. This reframes suffering from something to be feared to a platform for witness. It challenges me to rely on His promised wisdom and words in difficult moments, trusting that He will use them for His purpose.

4) On Enduring to the End

The ultimate promise is not a life without pain, but the preservation of our souls. 'Standing firm' through endurance, not escape, is the path to life. This steadies my heart, focusing my goal not on temporary safety but on final salvation through faithful perseverance.








Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne

Feast Day - November 18

Growing up in a prosperous
French family, Philippine joined,
the Visitation nuns, but returned to
her family during the French
Revolution. In 1804 she entered
the Society of the Sacred Heart.
After much preparation, she led a
missionary journey to Missouri in
1818. She set up the first free



school west of the Mississippi, Sacred Heart houses and Novitiate, and a school for Indians. Despite frontier hardships and ill health, she persevered in her early dream of serving Native Americans.

Saint Cecilia

Feast Day - November 22



Cecilia has been honored as a martyr since about 545. According to a written legend, The Passion of Saint Cecilia, she was a Roman Christian of the patrician class betrothed to the pagan Valerian. The Cecilia Passion has her singing to God in her heart on her wedding day, Cecilia tells Valerian she has made a vow of virginity and persuades him to convert to Christianity and enter into a celibate marriage. His brother, Tiburtius, also becomes a Christian. The brothers are later martyred. When Cecilia refuses to perform an idolatrous act, she too is martyred. Cecilia is the patron of musicians.


