Such was his intention when, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home.


For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her.

Gospel of Matthew

God is with us

In this wild, unpredictable ride that we call life, there is one thing we can always count on, one constant: Our Creator chooses to be with us throughout it all. No matter what unpredictable events take place in our lives, God's son, Jesus, promises to be there, guiding us and comforting us and challenging us, and helping us to take the next step in God's plan for us.

In Joseph's case, the way that God guided him was through an angel appearing to him in a dream. That may happen to you, but probably not. The good news is that God has many ways to appear to us, and to guide us on our life's journey. It might be a well-timed phone call or visit from a friend. It might be a verse of a hymn that we had not noticed before. It might be in some completely unexpected and surprising way. But when we have the eyes of faith, and when we trust in God, he will always be there for us, leading us on the way.

We are reminded of this promise in a very powerful way at the very end of Matthew's gospel. After Jesus has grown, and been baptized, and proclaimed the kingdom of heaven, and called his disciples, and been arrested and tortured and crucified, and raised from the dead, after all of this, Jesus gathered his disciples together one more time, to send them out to make disciples of all nations, and to baptize in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. But before he sent them out, he reminded them of this same promise. The last words spoken by Jesus in Matthew's Gospel would echo the words spoken by the angel to Joseph before Jesus was even born. Words which are at the heart of the good news recorded in the Gospel of Matthew. Jesus, our Emmanuel, who is our promise that God is with us, spoke these final words: And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.' God is with us, always.

Seeing Your Life Through the Lens of the Gospel

1) Joseph, described as a 'righteous man, planned to divorce Mary quietly rather than expose her to public shame. His righteousness was not about strict legalism but was tempered with profound mercy. How can I blend my commitment to what is right with a spirit of compassion and grace towards others, especially when I feel wronged?

2) God's guidance came to Joseph at a moment of deep personal crisis and confusion, through a dream. This reminds us that divine revelation often meets us in our uncertainty. In the "quiet dreams" of my life - in moments of prayer, silence, or wise counsel - am I creating space to listen for God's direction even when your own plans are falling apart?

3) Joseph's obedience was immediate, and he took Mary as his wife, embracing social ridicule and accepting a life he did not plan. This required tremendous courage. What costly obedience may God be asking of me? Where am I being called to do God's will, despite the potential for misunderstanding or personal cost?

4) "God with us." This is the ultimate truth that should help us in all Circumstances. How does the reality of 'God with us" impact my current situation - my fears, my relationships, my future? Do I live as if God is truly present in the midst of my ordinary, and sometimes messy, life?

Dear Friends in Christ,

Our celebration of Christmas 2025 comes during our Jubilee Year of Hope—a Holy Year inaugurated by Pope Francis and continued by Pope Leo XIV. How wonderful a blessing this is for us for hope is at the very heart of our Christmas joy. In the Incarnation, as the divine and human are united, hope becomes flesh in Jesus Christ.

St. Luke's Gospel conveys this hope in the first words of the Angel Gabriel to the shepherds at Christ's birth: *"Do not be afraid; for behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy... A Savior has been born for you who is Christ and Lord"* (Luke 2:10-11).

We have also witnessed the very best in humanity as countless generous and selfless individuals have worked to make a difference in the lives of our brothers and sisters who are suffering. In them, we see the darkness of despair overcome by the light and love of Christ.

An honest reflection must also acknowledge the challenges we face in our personal lives and as a nation. We are called to this reflection amid the noise and divisions of our time.


In his recent document *Delexi Te (I Have Loved You)*, Pope Leo XIV calls us to respond to the many "faces of the poor and of poverty," including "the poverty of those who lack material means of subsistence" and those "who are socially marginalized and lack the means to give voice to their dignity and abilities" (9). The Holy Father has also consistently urged world leaders to come together to find peaceful solutions to conflicts that inflict suffering and destroy the lives of the innocent.

This Christmas, I invite all of us to turn to God in fervent prayer for peace in our world. Let us unite in prayer that no one, especially innocent children, is forced to spend another year in fear, uncertainty, hunger and wondering if they will live to see another day or embrace their loved ones once again. 

Saint Peter Canisius *Feast Day - December 21*

This Doctor of the Church was born in Holland and studied canon law in Belgium before turning to the study of theology in Germany. In 1543, after meeting St. Peter Faber, one of St. Ignatius of Loyola's companions, he entered the Society of Jesus and soon became a well known preacher. He attended two sessions of the Council of Trent and was an important figure in the post-conciliar Catholic revival in Europe. After completing his doctorate, St. Ignatius assigned him to renew the Catholic faith in Germany. As the Jesuit provincial in southern Germany, Austria, and Bohemia, Peter Canisius started schools, colleges, and seminaries. He wrote three catechisms in German and is credited with keeping the southern German peoples Catholic.
