Gospel of Matthew

For many Christians, the Feast of the Epiphany marks the end of the Christmas season. Yet the Epiphany is at the heart of the Christmas message. The word 'epiphany' means 'manifestation' or 'showing.' Fundamentally, the Christian vocation is to show Jesus and His glory to the world.

Christmas and the Epiphany challenge us to renew our appreciation of the commitment God has made to us by becoming human. In the person and life of Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh, God has demonstrated beyond all doubt how much he loves us and shares his life with us. God shares his life with us especially through the Church and the sacraments. In the person and life of Jesus Christ, God has embraced human nature completely and he has become one with it. This is the mystery of Christmas and it remains true for all time and for all God's people everywhere. The Feast of the Epiphany invites us to consider once again the real meaning of Christmas and to respond accordingly. The wise men, in presenting Jesus with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh, acknowledged him as Savior of all people. The feast invites us to ask: what gift can we present to Jesus that acknowledges Him as our Savior?

Surely the most appropriate gift is striving to live a life that imitates His teaching and example. Therefore, the Epiphany is an ideal time to reflect on the practice of our Christian faith so that, during the coming year, we will 'show' the world the glory of the Savior who has redeemed us from sin and who gives us life through his Church and the celebration of the sacraments.

Seeing Your Life Through the Lens of the Gospel

1) Am I waiting for God to come to me or am I making my way to God? The Magi embarked on a long, arduous journey, seeking a king based on a celestial sign. Reflect on your own spiritual hunger. Are you actively seeking truth with that same determination, or are you waiting for it to come to you?

2) Herod and all Jerusalem were disturbed by the news of the coming of Christ, while the Magi were overjoyed. Does the Lordship of Christ in my life bring me anxiety, as it challenges my own 'rule,' or does it bring genuine joy and worship?

3) The religious leaders in Jerusalem knew the prophecy of Bethlehem but had no desire to go. We can 'know' the Scriptures in our heads but without actually letting it guide my steps. Am I really paying attention to God's Word to move me closer to Jesus?

4) Upon finding Jesus, the Magi bowed down and worshipped him before presenting gifts. True worship is the primary response to encountering Christ. Is my worship of the Lord a genuine, humble offering, or is it conditional and self-focused?

5) The Magi gave their gifts and then, in a dream, disobeyed Herod's command. Following Christ requires offering our best and sometimes defying worldly powers. Am I willing to surrender my treasures and change my course to remain faithful to Him?

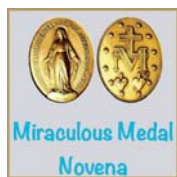

Saint John Neumann *Feast Day — January 5th*



A native of Bohemia, John entered the seminary and was nearing ordination when he departed for the United States. He joined the Redemptorists and served as a priest in New York, Maryland and Pennsylvania. In 1852 he was named the fourth bishop of Philadelphia. He founded more than 50 churches and greatly expanded Catholic education. John had a fondness for immigrants and knew six languages. His pastoral zeal was evident up to his last moments of life. He collapsed and died in the street at age 48.

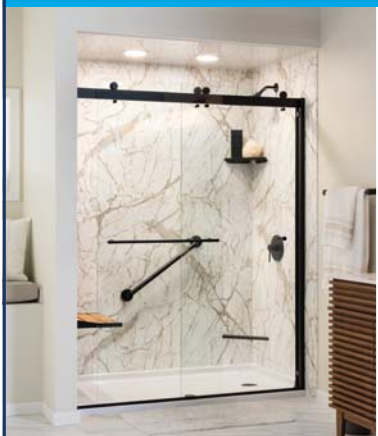
