

### A reading from the Gospel according to Luke

a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons, in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord. Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. This man was righteous and devout, awaiting the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Christ of the Lord. He came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to perform the

parents brought in the child Jesus to perform the custom of the law in regard to him, He took him into his arms and blessed God, saying:
"Now, Master, you may let your servant go in

"Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel."

The child's father and mother were amazed at what was said about him:

and Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother,

"Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted —and you yourself a sword will pierce—so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed."

There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived seven years with her husband after her marriage, and then as a widow until she was eighty-four.


She never left the temple, but worshiped night and day with fasting and prayer.

And coming forward at that very time, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem.

When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth.

The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.

# Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

It might be true to say that the focus of attention leading up and during the celebration of the Nativity is Jesus. This Sunday, we acknowledge the whole family!

There is often a sense of nostalgia and romance about the birth of Jesus. This can be heard in the best of our much-loved Christmas Carols and even seen in the worst of our Christmas cards!. That is not to say that they are not helpful, but we need to look beyond them, particularly on this great and important feast.

On this feast of the Holy Family, it is good to pray in gratefulness and thanks for our own parents and family. No one's family is perfect. All our family members, including ourselves have made mistakes and got things wrong. We have all done and said things that we have later regretted. Regardless of this, we owe our family everything and for this we thank God.

St. Eugene de Mazenod, the founder of the Oblates of Mary Immaculate came from what today could be called a 'broken family.' His parents divorced in 1795. Eugene was just seventeen years of age. This happened at a time when divorce was rare. Eugene had a far from ideal family life. He is the Patron Saint of Broken Families.

Prayers to St. Eugene can be very helpful and supportive for people who are experiencing problems in their family life. On this feast day, let us do just that; let us pray for all those we know who are experiencing the pain and difficulty of problems in their married and family life.

### Seeing your Life through the Lens of the Gospel:

- 1. What started out as an ordinary day for Joseph and Mary turned out to be a day with an encounter they would remember for a long time. Perhaps you too have had significant encounters on what you expected to be just an ordinary day?
- 2. Simeon gave thanks because his eyes saw the salvation God had prepared. As you look back on the year ending today, in what ways have you experienced God's salvation in your life: an experience of being loved, or discovering a sense of purpose in life, or being touched by the wonders of creation? Give thanks for those memories.
- 3. Perhaps the past year may also have been one in which you have experienced great sorrow. What sword has pierced your soul and what has helped you to cope with it?
- 4. The final sentence speaks of Jesus as one who grew and became strong and was filled with wisdom. What has helped you to grow in wisdom? Have you seen others grow in wisdom through the experience of life? Recall times when you had a sense of growing up in some way. What brought that about? Think also of how you have seen growth in another person.



### Pope Francis: Let Mary Teach You What to Do in the New Year

'She tenderly takes care — this is the language of Mary — to tenderly take care of the Child. This is Mary's greatness.'

Let Mary, the Mother of God, be your guide in the new year.

Pope Francis says: "As we contemplate Mary in the stable where Jesus was born, let us ask ourselves: What languages does the Holy Virgin use to speak to us? How does Mary speak?" "What can we learn from her for this year that is dawning?" he added. "We can say: Virgin Mary, teach us what we should do this year."

The Gospel of Luke describes the shepherds' encounter with the Holy Family and how they saw the Infant Jesus "lying in the manger."

"This verb 'to lay' means to carefully place and tells us that the language proper to Mary is maternal: She tenderly takes care — this is the language of Mary — to tenderly take care of the Child. This is Mary's greatness," he said.

He described a noisy scene: the angels celebrating Christ's birth and the shepherds running to meet Jesus with everyone loudly praising God.

"Mary does not speak," Pope Francis said, "she does not steal the show — we like to steal the show! On the contrary, she puts the Child in the center; she lovingly takes care of him." The Pope recalled a line of poetry from the Italian writer Alda Merini, which says that Mary "even knew how to be solemnly because she did not want to lose sight of her God."

All mothers do the same, he said: "After having carried the gift of a mysterious prodigy in their womb for nine months, mothers constantly put their babies at the center of their attention: They feed them; they hold them in their arms; they tenderly lay them down in the crib." The Mother of God's language is "a language of a mother," he added.

Mary, Pope Francis said, "reminds us that, if we truly want the new year to be good, if we want to reconstruct hope, we need to abandon the language, those actions and those choices inspired by egoism, and learn the language of love, which is to take care."

He continued: "This is the commitment: to take care of our lives, of our time, of our souls; to take care of creation and the environment we live in; and even more, to take care of our neighbor, of those whom the Lord has placed alongside us, as well as our brothers
