## Getting to the Event



When I arrive at Queen Victoria Market, The Festival is in Sheds C and D.



There will be Festival volunteers holding a paddle with the Festival signage to assist in directing me on where to go.

If I am arriving from Elizabeth Street, I will walk up Therry Street



I will then cross Queen Street and then proceed up through the lower part of Sheds C & D



I will walk up through the stalls of Sheds C & D until I get to the Bastille Day French Festival (French Winter Market).

If I am arriving from Peel Street, I will proceed straight in Sheds C & D and the Festival.



If I am arriving from the outdoor carpark, I can proceed through Sheds L – E to get to Sheds C & D



## **The French Winter Market (Sheds C & D)**

The French Winter Market is set up in a rectangle with stalls around the outside and seating in the middle.

There will be marquees with blue, white and red tops.

There will be tables with red and white table cloths and white chairs.

The French Winter Market will open from 9am – 4pm on Saturday 11 July and Sunday 12 July.

It is free to enter and I don't need a ticket.

I can wander around at my own pace and stay for as long or little as I like.

There are many things to discover at the Festival.



I might see people cooking delicious French food, musicians performing, artists entertaining the crowd and market stalls selling French products.

I might also see a large Eiffel Tower display, people playing pétanque and families enjoying the activities together.



Many people come to the Festival.

Sometimes it may feel busy.

Sometimes there may be noise from the live performers on the stage.

Sometimes it might be noisy from lots of people chatting.

Sometimes there may be crowd interaction and dancing at the Main Stage. I don't need to participate if I don't want to.

I might see roving performers including a Mime artist and accordion players.

There will be many different food stalls cooking and selling different food. I might be able to smell some of the food as I walk around.

I can purchase food and drink from any of the stalls. They might be busy and sometimes I may need to wait.

That is okay. I can take my time.

Once I have purchased my food, I can find a table and chair to sit down at.

If I can't find something at the Market, there will be signs hanging from the ceiling pointing out main areas of the French Winter Market.

If I want to ask a question, I can visit the Information Desk located near the Eiffel Tower.



If I have questions during the Festival, I can ask any volunteer dressed in a striped uniform. Volunteers will speak English, some may speak French too. I don't need to speak French.

The Festival will have an Opening Ceremony on the Saturday at 11.30am on the Main Stage. There will be speeches and performances.

I am welcome to stop and listen if I would like to.

After the Opening Ceremony, there will be Can Can dancers.

Many people may gather to watch. If it is too noisy or busy for me, I can move to another area or take a break.



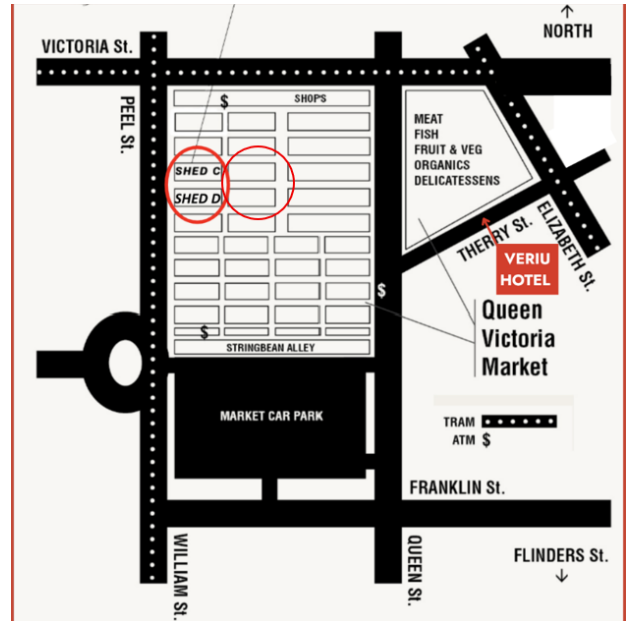
There will be signs around the Festival.

Some signs will have QR codes.

I can scan a QR code with my phone.

The QR code will take me to the Festival program.

The program will show me what is happening throughout the day.



It is okay if I need a break.

There is a Quiet Space at Veriu Queen Victoria Market, located on Therry Street.

The Quiet Space is calm and quiet. I can sit and rest there.

If I need help in locating the Quiet Space, volunteers will be available to help me.



There are accessible toilets located throughout the Queen Victoria Market.

I can use an accessible toilet if I need to.

If I am unsure where to find it, I can ask a volunteer for help.



The Festival is easy to move around.

There is step-free access across the site.

Service animals are welcome.



When I am ready, I can go home.

I may feel excited.

I may feel tired.

I enjoyed my visit to the Bastille Day French  
Festival.

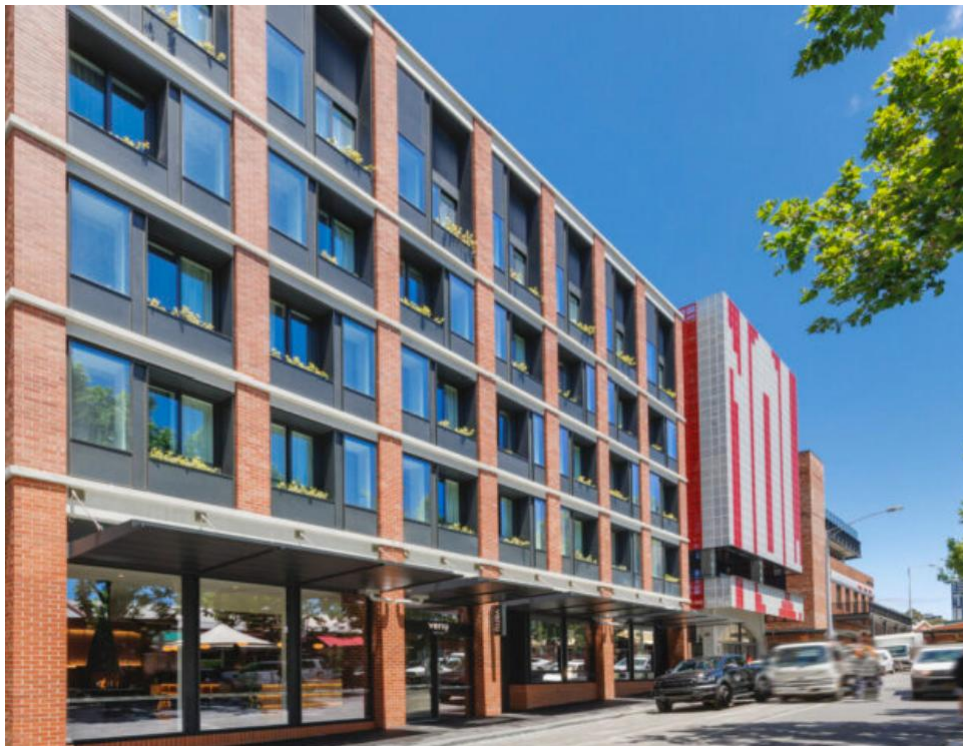
## Cultural Program



Some activities at the Festival need a ticket.

These include Les Lumières talks, masterclasses, yoga and walking tours.

These events are located nearby at Veriu Queen Victoria Market hotel. This is located on Therry Street.



If I have booked one of these activities, I will need to bring my Eventbrite e-ticket with me.



I can open my e-ticket on my phone before I arrive.



When I arrive at the location of my activity, a volunteer will greet me.

The volunteer will use a phone to scan the QR code on my ticket.

If I need help finding my ticket, I can ask a volunteer.



The Les Lumières talks and Masterclasses are seated events.

Once my ticket has been scanned, I can enter the room and find a seat.

If I need help, I can ask a volunteer.



The speaker/host will welcome everyone.

People will listen while they are talking.

Some people may laugh, clap or ask questions.

I can listen and participate in a way that feels comfortable for me.



When the event is over, people will leave the room.

I can take my time.

I may choose to continue exploring the Bastille Day French Festival or head home.
