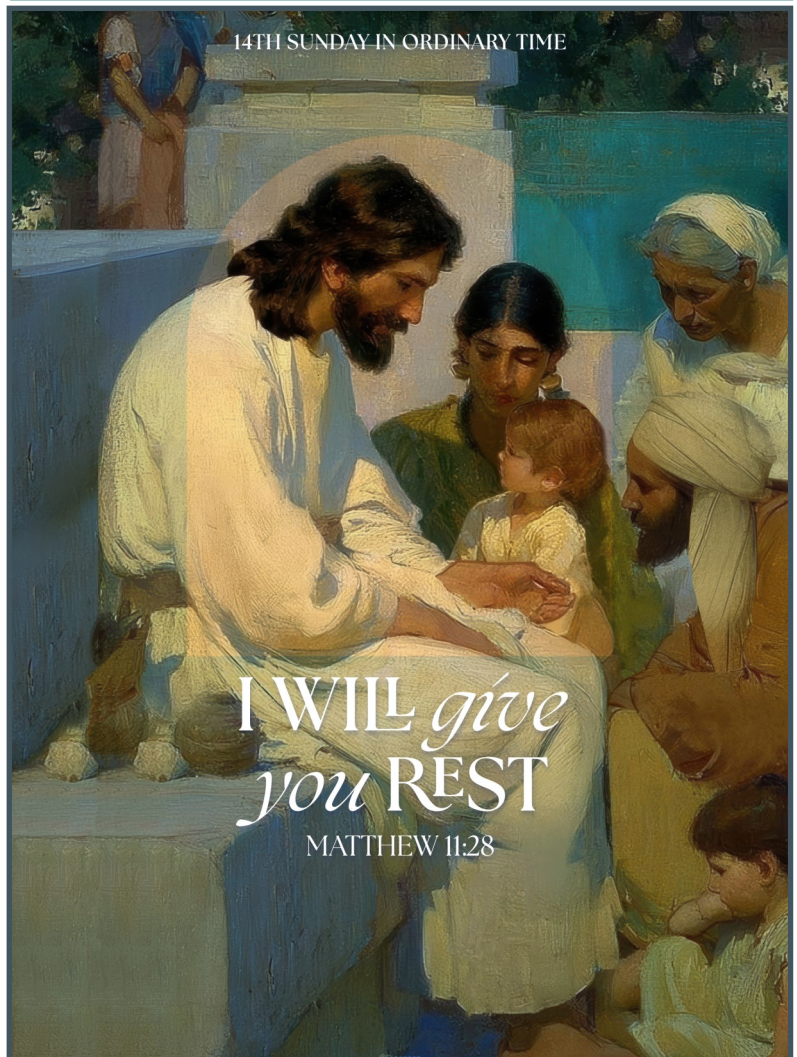

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

All of our parishes will take up a collection next weekend, July 11/12, to support Catholic Relief Services, which provides aid to vulnerable people affected by war, natural disasters, and exploitation.

Human trafficking is the exploitation of a person compelled through force, fraud, or coercion to provide work or service, regardless of nationality, citizenship or geographic location. Poverty, isolation from the support of family and friends, and cultural or language barriers are among the factors that place people at risk of trafficking. In light of these challenges, successful anti-trafficking efforts must involve communities that can recognize the signs of trafficking and provide direct assistance to victims. School teachers, parish staff and clergy, and health care providers at community clinics — with training to recognize the signs of human trafficking in their own communities — can be effective in combatting the exploitation of those they serve.

With funds received through the annual Catholic Relief Services collection, the Office of Migration and Refugee Services (MRS) of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops launched a pilot program to combat human trafficking in certain U.S. dioceses. Working with local partners, MRS staff assessed the challenges facing those communities, trained local leaders, and helped them establish networks to respond to the needs of victims.

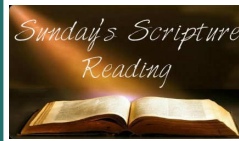

### RELIGIOUS EDUCATION REGISTRATION IS NOW OPEN!



Welcome to **Religious Education** at St. Jude Parish. When your child was baptized, you made a sacred promise to raise them in the Catholic faith. Our Religious Education program exists to support and accompany you in fulfilling that promise. Together, we strive to help children and families grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ and become active members of His Church.

#### 1<sup>ST</sup> - 6<sup>TH</sup> Grade

- Classes are held weekly on Sunday mornings from **10:30 a.m. - 11:45 a.m.**
- Classes begin **SUNDAY SEPTEMBER 20, 2026**
- Preparation for **First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion** is a 2-year program beginning when students are in the 1st or 2nd grade.
- Our **Special Sacraments Program** is available for those students who are in the 3rd grade or higher, and desire the sacraments of Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. The Special Sacraments Class is also a 2-year preparation program.

#### 7<sup>TH</sup> Grade +

Beginning in 7th grade, students are invited into our Small Group Discipleship Ministry, where **Confirmation** discernment takes place. Youth, **7th grade and higher**, gather in small groups with mentors to build community, encounter Christ, grow in their faith and become missionary disciples. It is our hope that these small groups will grow in faith and discipleship, not just for the length of sacramental preparation, but beyond. Preparation for Confirmation is a minimum of 2 years.

- The small groups also meet on **Sunday** mornings from **10:30 a.m. - 11:45 a.m.**
