

From the desk of Fr. John ...

I begin this letter with heartfelt gratitude to all of you for your generosity to the Parish, as well as to Fathers Michael, Chris and myself, during this Christmas season. Your cards, notes and gifts touched us all deeply. The three of us always say we are blessed to be here with so many wonderful people. May God bless you abundantly for your kindness!

As you may remember when we renovated the Sanctuary we said the next phase would be the renovation of the Sacristy. We are now ready to begin that projectthis coming week we will begin demolition of the Sacristy. Due to the demolition there will be a few changes to our practices. The most regrettable one is that the Adoration Chapel will be closed for the duration of the project. It will serve as a make shift sacristy. Another change is that we will not be able to offer the Precious Blood at Communion as the chalices and cases of wine are packed away. Remember though what the Church teaches—in receiving the consecrated host we receive the whole Christ—Body and Blood. The folks who wash and iron the altar linens will be able to collect them from Father Chris or myself. We have been told that the project should not take more than a month to complete. I wish to remind you that we have the funds on hand to complete the project—the funds were part of the original campaign. I would never put us into debt. This is a necessary improvement project—the present cabinets and drawers do not close properly any more. We lack adequate storage for the liturgical books, vessels and vestments. Thank you for your understanding.

I am very grateful to Bob Heinlein who provided us with the book 33 Days to Eucharistic Glory. I trust that our reading of the book, reflecting on what we read and praying will definitely deepen our relationship with the Lord and produce good fruit in us as individuals and as a Parish.

I hope to see you at Bingo, Burgers and Brews on January 10th at 6pm in Mt. Carmel Hall.

THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

There are a number of people who personally experienced the birth of Jesus and had their own unique of epiphany or revelation. I think of the shepherds in Luke's gospel who, at first, responded in fear when the angel announced the birth; but their fear changed to joy after they behold the baby with their own eyes and went out to tell the good news of his birth.

I hink of the Magi, mysterious sages from the East who traveled far, risking everything on the promise of a star, and presented precious gifts when they beheld the baby with their own eyes.

I think of Herod, an insecure king who did not heed the prophecies of his own faith tradition. He did not bother to see the child himself but instead, in jealous rage, sought to kill him by ordering the deaths of young innocents throughout Bethlehem.

I think of Joseph and Mary who experienced this newborn child in the most personal way. Joseph, the honorable man who was troubled by the unexpected pregnancy of his betrothed, but reassured by an angel in a dream that this was all part of God's plan. And Mary, who said "Yes" to God and never wavered in her unshakable faith. Joseph and Mary's faith was put to the test again when they packed up what little they had and quickly made the long, treacherous journey to Egypt to escape Herod's rage to protect this Child whom God had entrusted to them.

I think about you and me. The beauty of the Christmas story is that although we have not seen the baby with our own eyes, we have experienced Jesus intimately through the sacraments, through prayer, and within our faith community.

The feast of the Epiphany is not just a story from 2,000 years ago; it is a celebration for us today. It is a reminder that Christ came not only for a particular people but for all people. As we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord, let us renew our commitment to follow Christ, to let His light shine through us, and to see each other through the eyes of faith. Let us be the light of Christ in a world that so desperately needs it.

As we begin this New Year, my prayer for you and your loved ones comes from Numbers 6:24-26: "The Lord bless you and keep you! The Lord let His face shine upon you, and be gracious to you! The Lord look upon you kindly and give you peace!"


